  - Windows 7: Click or tap  $Start \rightarrow Shut down$ .

- **3** Disconnect your computer and all attached devices from their electrical outlets.
- 4 Disconnect all cables such as telephone cables, network cables and so on, from your computer.
- **5** Disconnect all attached devices and peripherals, such as keyboard, mouse, monitor, and so on, from your computer.
- 6 Remove any media card and optical disc from your computer, if applicable.
- 7 After the computer is unplugged, press and hold the power button for 5 seconds to ground the system board.





  - CAUTION: To prevent damage to the memory module, hold the memory module by the edges. Do not touch the components on the memory module.

4 Lift the memory module out of the memory-module slot.



NOTE: If the memory module is difficult to remove, gently ease the memory module back and forth to remove it from the slot.





- 4 Close the side-chassis.









# **BIOS setup program**

#### **Overview**



CAUTION: Unless you are an expert computer user, do not change the settings in the BIOS setup program. Certain changes can make your computer work incorrectly.



**NOTE:** Before you change BIOS setup program, it is recommended that you write down the BIOS setup program screen information for future reference

Use BIOS setup program to:

- Get information about the hardware installed in your computer, such as the amount of RAM, the size of the hard drive, and so on.
- Change the system configuration information.
- Set or change a user-selectable option, such as the user password, type of ٠ hard drive installed, enabling or disabling base devices, and so on.

#### **Entering BIOS setup program**

- 1 Turn on (or restart) your computer.
- 2 During POST, when the DELL logo is displayed, watch for the F2 prompt to appear and then press F2 immediately.



**NOTE:** The F2 prompt indicates that the keyboard has initialized. This prompt can appear very quickly, so you must watch for it, and then press F2. If you press F2 before the F2 prompt, this keystroke is lost. If you wait too long and the operating system logo appears, continue to wait until you see the operating system's desktop. Then, turn off your computer and try again.

Open the side-chassis. 1




- 1 side-chassis
- Remove the jumper plug from the default jumper-pins and connect it to 2 the password jumper-pins.

**3** Wait for 5 seconds and then replace the jumper plug in its original location.

Open the side-chassis. 1




- 1 side-chassis
- Remove the jumper plug from the default jumper-pins and connect it to 2 the CMOS jumper-pins.

**3** Wait for 5 seconds and then replace the jumper plug in its original location.



- 1 jumper plug
- 3 CMOS jumper-pins
- 2 default jumper-pins

4 Close the side-chassis.

- 2 Replace the <u>computer cover</u>.

# Flashing the BIOS

You may need to flash (update) the BIOS when an update is available or when you replace the system board. To flash the BIOS:

- 1 Turn on the computer.
- 2 Go to www.dell.com/support.
- 3 Click **Product Support**, enter the Service Tag of your computer and click Submit.



**NOTE:** If you do not have the Service Tag, use the auto-detect feature or manually browse for your computer model.

- 4 Click Drivers & downloads.
- 5 Select the operating system installed on your computer.
- 6 Scroll down the page and expand BIOS.
- 7 Click Download File to download the latest version of the BIOS for your computer.
- 8 Save the file and, once the download is complete, navigate to the folder where you saved the BIOS update file.
- 9 Double-click the BIOS update file icon and follow the instructions on the screen


