



Maintenance guidelines

Cleaning your monitor

△ CAUTION: Read and follow the Safety instructions before cleaning the monitor.

MARNING: Before cleaning the monitor, unplug the monitor power cable from the electrical outlet.

For best practices, follow the instructions in the list below when unpacking, cleaning, or handling your monitor:

- To clean your anti-static screen, lightly dampen a soft, clean cloth with water. If possible, use a special screen-cleaning tissue or solution suitable for the anti-static coating. Do not use benzene, thinner, ammonia, abrasive cleaners, or compressed air.
- Use a lightly-dampened, warm cloth to clean the monitor. Avoid using detergent of any kind as some detergents leave a milky film on the monitor.
- If you notice white powder when you unpack your monitor, wipe it off with a cloth.
- Handle your monitor with care as a darker-colored monitor may get scratched and show white scuff marks more than a lighter-colored monitor.
- To help maintain the best image quality on your monitor, use a dynamically changing screen saver and turn off your monitor when not in use.

Setting up the monitor

Attaching the stand



- NOTE: The following instructions are applicable only for attaching the stand that was shipped with your monitor. If you are attaching a stand that you purchased from any other source, follow the set up instructions that were included with the stand.
- △ CAUTION: The steps are important to protect your curved screen. Do follow the instructions below to finish up the installation.

To attach the monitor stand:

1. After opening the box, remove the foam cushion from the top of the package.



2. Invert the foam cushion and place it on a flat surface.



3. Gently lift up the monitor by holding it firmly on both sides.



4. Place the monitor on the foam and lift the cover from the monitor.




5. Place the monitor on the foam with the screen facing down.




6. Attach the stand riser till it snaps into place.



- 7. Connect the necessary cables to the monitor, as shown in the illustration, and route the cables through the cable-management slot on the stand riser.
 - a. Power cable

 - c. HDMI cable (optional, cable not included)
 - d. USB upstream cable
 - e. USB downstream cables (optional, cable not included)

 - **8.** Ensure the tabs on the I/O cover are aligned with the slot 1 and slot 2 at the rear of the monitor.
 - **9.** Ensure the tabs on the I/O cover are aligned with the slots 3 and slots 4 at the rear of the monitor.



10. Slide the I/O cover until it snaps into place.



- Connect the upstream USB 3.0 port (cable supplied) to an appropriate USB 3.0 port on your computer. (See Rear and bottom view for details.)
- **3.** Connect the USB 3.0 peripherals to the downstream USB 3.0 ports on the monitor.

- 4. Plug the power cables for your computer and monitor into a nearby outlet.
- **5.** Turn On the monitor and the computer.

If your monitor displays an image, installation is complete. If it does not display an image, see **Universal Serial Bus (USB) specific problems**.







Troubleshooting

MARNING: Before you begin any of the procedures in this section, follow the Safety instructions.

Self-test

Your monitor provides a self-test feature that allows you to check whether your monitor is functioning properly. If your monitor and computer are properly connected but the monitor screen remains dark, run the monitor self-test by performing the following steps:

- 1. Turn off both your computer and the monitor.
- **2.** Unplug the video cable from the back of the computer. To ensure proper Self-Test operation, remove all digital cables from the back of computer.
- **3.** Turn on the monitor.

NOTE: A dialog box should appear on-screen (against a black background), if the monitor cannot sense a video signal and is working correctly. While in self-test mode, the power LED blinks white.



NOTE: This box also appears during normal system operation, if the video cable is disconnected or damaged.

4. Turn Off your monitor and reconnect the video cable; then turn On both your computer and the monitor.


If your monitor screen remains blank after you use the previous procedure, check your video controller and computer, because your monitor is functioning properly.

Built-in diagnostics

Your monitor has a built-in diagnostic tool that helps you determine if the screen abnormality you are experiencing is an inherent problem with your monitor, or with your computer and video card.



NOTE: You can run the built-in diagnostics only when the video cable is unplugged and the monitor is in self-test mode.



To run the built-in diagnostics:

- 1. Ensure that the screen is clean (no dust particles on the surface of the screen).
- 2. Unplug the video cable(s) from the back of the computer or monitor. The monitor then goes into the self-test mode.
- 3. Press and hold Button 3 for 5 seconds. A gray screen appears after 1 second.
- **4.** Carefully inspect the screen for abnormalities.
- 5. Press Button 3 again. The color of the screen changes to red.
- **6.** Inspect the display for any abnormalities.
- 7. Repeat steps 5 and 6 to inspect the display in green, blue, black, and white screens.

The test is complete when the white screen appears. To exit, press Button 3 again.

If you do not detect any screen abnormalities upon using the built-in diagnostic tool, the monitor is functioning properly. Check the video card and computer.

Common problems

The following table contains general information about common monitor problems you might encounter and the possible solutions:

Common symptoms	What you experience	Possible solutions
No Video/ Power LED off	No picture	 Ensure that the video cable connecting the monitor and the computer is properly connected and secure. Verify that the power outlet is functioning properly using any other electrical equipment. Ensure that the power button is depressed fully. No Video/ Power LED on	No picture or no brightness	 Increase brightness & contrast controls via OSD. Perform monitor self-test feature check. Check for bent or broken pins in the video cable connector. Run the built-in diagnostics. Ensure that the correct input source is selected in the Input Source menu.
Poor Focus	Picture is fuzzy, blurry, or ghosting	 Eliminate video extension cables. Reset the monitor to factory settings. Change the video resolution to the correct aspect ratio.
