Working on Your Computer

Before Working Inside Your Computer

- You have performed the steps in Working on Your Computer.
- You have read the safety information that shipped with your computer.
- A component can be replaced or--if purchased separately--installed by performing the removal procedure in reverse order.

CAUTION: Many repairs may only be done by a certified service technician. You should only perform troubleshooting and simple repairs as authorized in your product documentation, or as directed by the online or telephone service and support team. 



To avoid damaging your computer, perform the following steps before you begin working inside the computer.


- 1. Ensure that your work surface is flat and clean to prevent the computer cover from being scratched.
- 2. Turn off your computer (see *Turning Off Your Computer*).
- 3. If the computer is connected to a docking device (docked) such as the optional Media Base or Battery Slice, undock it.




- 4. Disconnect all network cables from the computer.
- 5. Disconnect your computer and all attached devices from their electrical outlets.
- 6. Close the display and turn the computer upside-down on a flat work surface.



- 7. Remove the main battery.
- 8. Turn the computer top-side up.
- 9. Open the display.
- 10. Press the power button to ground the system board.






11. Remove any installed ExpressCards or Smart Cards from the appropriate slots.

Turning Off Your Computer



- 1. Shut down the operating system:
 - In Windows Vista:

Click **Start**, then click the arrow in the lower-right corner of the **Start** menu as shown below, and then click **Shut Down**.



- In Windows XP:
 Click Start → Turn Off Computer → Turn Off . The computer turns off after the operating system shutdown process is complete.
- Ensure that the computer and all attached devices are turned off. If your computer and attached devices did not automatically turn off when you shut down your operating system, press and hold the power button for about 4 seconds to turn them off.

After Working Inside Your Computer

After you complete any replacement procedure, ensure you connect any external devices, cards, and cables before turning on your computer.

CAUTION: To avoid damage to the computer, use only the battery designed for this particular Dell computer. Do not use batteries designed for other Dell computers.

- 1. Connect any external devices, such as a port replicator, battery slice, or media base, and replace any cards, such as an ExpressCard.
- 2. Connect any telephone or network cables to your computer.
- CAUTION: To connect a network cable, first plug the cable into the network device and then plug it into the computer.
- 3. Replace the battery.
- 4. Connect your computer and all attached devices to their electrical outlets.
- **5.** Turn on your computer.

Battery

Removing The Battery

- 1. Follow the procedures in *Before Working On Your Computer*.
- 2. Slide the left and the right battery release latches to the unlock position.



3. Slide the battery and remove it from the computer.



Installing The Battery

- 1. Slide the battery into its slot until it clicks into place.

Memory Card

Removing The Memory Card

- 1. Follow the procedures in Before Working On Your Computer.
- 2. Press in on the memory card to release it from the computer.



3. Slide the memory card out of the computer.



Installing The Memory Card

- Push the memory card into the compartment until it is fully engaged with a click sound.
- 2. Follow the procedures in After Working Inside Your Computer.

ExpressCard

Removing The ExpressCard

- 1. Follow the procedures in *Before Working On Your Computer*.
- 2. Press the ExpressCard to release it from the computer.



3. Slide the ExpressCard out of the computer.



Installing The ExpressCard

- 1. Push the ExpressCard into the compartment slot until it clicks into place.
- 2. Install the battery.
- 3. Follow the procedures in After Working Inside Your Computer.

Memory Door

Removing The Memory Door

- 1. Follow the procedures in *Before Working On Your Computer*.
- 2. Loosen the screw that secures the memory door.



3. Pry up the memory door near the screw hole, lift and remove it.





Removing The Memory Module

5. Use a screwdriver to gently pry the optical drive out of the computer.

7. Remove the optical drive bracket from the optical drive module.



Installing The Optical Drive

- 2. Slide the optical drive into the compartment on the chassis.
- 3. Tighten the screw to secure the optical drive to the computer.

Keyboard
