



This section provides procedures for removing and installing the components in your computer. Unless otherwise noted, each procedure assumes that the following conditions exist:

- 1 You have performed the steps in <u>Turning Off Your Computer</u> and <u>Before Working Inside Your Computer</u>
- 1 You have read the safety information shipped with your computer.
- 1 A component can be replaced or—if purchased separately—installed by performing the removal procedure in reverse order.

Recommended Tools

The procedures in this document may require the following tools:

- 1 Small flat-blade screwdriver
- 1 Phillips screwdriver
- 1 Flash BIOS update program CD

Turning Off Your Computer

- NOTICE: To avoid losing data, save and close all open files and exit all open programs before you turn off your computer.
- 1. Save and close all open files and exit all open programs.
- 2. Click Start , click the arrow , and then click Shut Down.

The computer turns off after the operating system shutdown process finishes.

3. Ensure that the computer and all attached devices are turned off. If your computer and attached devices did not automatically turn off when you shut down your operating system, press and hold the power button until the computer turns off.

Before Working Inside Your Computer

Use the following safety guidelines to help protect your computer from potential damage and to help to ensure your own personal safety.

- CAUTION: Before working inside your computer, read the safety information that shipped with your computer. For additional safety best practices information, see the Regulatory Compliance Homepage at www.dell.com/regulatory_compliance.
- NOTICE: Handle components and cards with care. Do not touch the components or contacts on a card. Hold a card by its edges or by its metal mounting bracket. Hold a component such as a processor by its edges, not by its pins.
- NOTICE: Only a certified service technician should perform repairs on your computer. Damage due to servicing that is not authorized by Dell is not covered by your warranty.

- NOTICE: To avoid damage to the computer, use only the battery designed for this particular Dell computer. Do not use batteries designed for other Dell computers.
- 6. Remove the main battery:
 - a. Unlock the battery by sliding the battery-lock latch towards the outer edge.
 - b. Slide the battery-bay release latch and hold it.
 - c. Remove the battery from the battery bay.

1. Ensure that the AC adapter is plugged in and that the main battery is installed properly.

MOTE: If you use a BIOS-update program CD to flash the BIOS, set up the computer to boot from a CD before inserting the CD.

2. Insert the BIOS-update program CD, and restart the computer.

Follow the instructions that appear on the screen. The computer continues to boot and updates the new BIOS. When the flash update is complete, the computer will automatically reboot.

- 3. Press <F2> during POST to enter the system setup program.
- 4. Press <Alt><f> to reset the computer defaults.
- 5. Press <Esc>, select Save changes and reboot, and press <Enter> to save configuration changes
- 6. Remove the BIOS-update program CD from the drive and restart the computer.

Flashing the BIOS From the Hard Drive

- 1. Ensure that the AC adapter is plugged in, the main battery is properly installed, and a network cable is attached
- 2. Turn on the computer.
- 3. Locate the latest BIOS update file for your computer at support.dell.com.
- 4. Click **Download Now** to download the file.
- 5. If the Export Compliance Disclaimer window appears, click Yes, I Accept this Agreement.

The File Download window appears.

6. Click Save this program to disk and then click OK.

The Save In window appears.

7. Click the down arrow to view the Save In menu, select Desktop, and then click Save

The file downloads to your desktop.

8. Click Close if the Download Complete window appears.

The file icon appears on your desktop and is titled the same as the downloaded BIOS update file.

9. Double-click the file icon on the desktop and follow the instructions on the screen.

Removing the Processor

- NOTICE: To prevent intermittent contact between the ZIF-socket cam screw and the processor when removing or replacing the processor, press to apply slight pressure to the center of the processor while turning the cam screw.
- NOTICE: To avoid damage to the processor, hold the screwdriver so that it is perpendicular to the processor when turning the cam screw.
- 1. Follow the instructions in "Before You Begin" on page 9.
- 2. Remove the heat sink (see Processor Heat Sink).
- 3. To loosen the ZIF socket, use a small, flat-blade screwdriver and rotate the ZIF-socket cam screw counterclockwise until it comes to the cam stop.

The ZIF-socket cam screw secures the processor to the system board. Make a note of the arrow on the ZIF-socket cam screw.

- NOTICE: To ensure maximum cooling for the processor, do not touch the heat transfer areas on the processor heat sink. The oils in your skin can reduce the heat transfer capability of the thermal pads.
- NOTICE: When removing the processor, pull it straight up. Be careful not to bend the pins on the processor.
- 4. Lift the processor from the ZIF socket.

Replacing the Processor

- NOTICE: Ensure that the cam lock is in the fully open position before seating the processor. Seating the processor properly in the ZIF socket does not require force.
- NOTICE: A processor that is not properly seated can result in an intermittent connection or permanent damage to the processor and the ZIF socket.

- 1. Align the pin-1 corner of the processor so that it points to the triangle on the ZIF socket, and insert the processor into the ZIF socket.
 - When the processor is correctly seated, all four corners are aligned at the same height. If one or more corners of the processor are higher than the others, the processor is not seated correctly.
- NOTICE: To prevent intermittent contact between the ZIF-socket cam screw and the processor when removing or replacing the processor, press to apply slight pressure to the center of the processor while turning the cam screw.
- 2. Tighten the ZIF socket by turning the cam screw clockwise to secure the processor to the system board.
- 3. Peel the backing off the thermal cooling pad and adhere the thermal pad to the portion of the processor heat sink that covers the processor.
- 4. Follow the instructions in Replacing the Processor Heat Sink.
- 5. Update the BIOS using a flash BIOS-update program CD (see Flashing the BIOS).



Replacing the Processor Heat Sink

NOTE: The original thermal pad can be reused if the original processor and processor heat sink are reinstalled together. If either the processor or the processor heat sink is replaced, use the thermal pad provided in the kit to ensure that thermal conductivity is achieved.

NOTE: This procedure assumes that you have already removed the processor heat sink and are ready to replace it.

- 1. Peel the backing off the thermal pad and adhere the pad to the portion of the processor heat sink assembly that covers the processor.
- 2. Slide the processor heat sink under the bracket and align the four captive screws with the screw holes on the system board.
- 3. Tighten the four captive screws.
- 4. Follow the instructions in Replacing the System Board.





- 3. Remove the WLAN card (see Removing the WLAN Card).
- 4. Remove the center control cover (see Removing the Center Control Cover).
- 5. Remove the keyboard (see Removing the Keyboard).
- 6. Remove the mylar tapes and then remove the two screws from the back of the computer.





- 8. Replace the memory modules (see Replacing the Memory Module(s)).
- 9. Slide the battery into the battery bay, until it clicks in place.




