- 1 Save and close all open files and exit all open programs.
- 2 Follow the instructions to shut down your computer based on the operating system installed on your computer.
 - Windows 8: Move your mouse-pointer to the upper-right or lower-right corner of the screen to open the Charms sidebar, and then click **Settings**→ **Power**→ Shut down.
 - Windows 7 Click **Start** and click **Shut down**.

Microsoft Windows shuts down and then the computer turns off.



NOTE: If you are using a different operating system, see the documentation of your operating system for shut-down instructions.

- 3 Disconnect your computer and all attached devices from their electrical outlets.
- 4 Disconnect all telephone cables, network cables, and attached devices from your computer.
- 5 Slide and hold the power switch for 5 seconds, after the computer is unplugged, to ground the system board.




















