







- 5 Click **Download File** to download the latest BIOS file.
- 6 In the **Please select your download method below** window, click For Single File Download via Browser, and then click **Download Now**.
- 7 In the Save As window, select an appropriate location to download the file on your computer.
- 8 If the **Download Complete** window appears, click **Close**.
- **9** Navigate to the folder where you downloaded the BIOS update file.
- **10** Double-click the BIOS update file icon and follow the instructions that appear on the screen.
