# Setting Up Your Dell Streak 7 Tablet


## **Getting Your Tablet Ready for Use**

Insert the SIM card on 3G model (Optional)



- 1 Pull out the slot door.
- 2 Hold the SIM card with the metal contacts facing down, and follow the SIM card illustration on the slot door label to insert the SIM card into the SIM card slot.

## Insert the SD card



Pull out the slot door.

Hold the SD card with the metal contacts facing down, and follow the 2 SD card illustration on the slot door label to insert the SD card into the SD card slot.

#### Charge the battery



CAUTION: Charging your tablet when the ambient temperature is not between 0°C - 45°C can damage your tablet.




**NOTE:** The battery cannot be charged by connecting your device to a computer.



**NOTE:** The battery is not fully charged when first unpacked.

1 Connect the supplied USB cable's 30-pin connector to the 30-pin port on the device.



- 2 Connect the cable's USB connector to the supplied USB wallcharger adapter.
- **3** Connect the USB wall-charger adapter into an electrical outlet and charge the device until the battery is fully charged.
- **NOTE:** When charging the battery by connecting the device to an electrical outlet, the battery is fully charged in about 4 hours.
- **NOTE:** The cable is specific for this device: 30-pin to USB and the length is less than 3 meters.

## **Turning On Your Device**



**NOTE:** Use this device in an environmental temperature between -10°C and 55°C.

- 1 Press and hold the Power and Sleep/Wake button **(a)** to turn on your device.
- 2 If the lock screen appears, touch and hold the lock icon (a). When it turns into a circle, drag it to the edge of the larger circle that surrounds it to unlock the screen.
- **3** If your SIM card is locked by a Personal Identification Number (PIN), type the PIN by touching the corresponding number keys using the on-screen keypad. Touch the **OK** button to confirm your input.

The device is ready for use when the Home screen is displayed.

## **Turning Off Your Device**

- 1 Press and hold the Power and Sleep/Wake button .
- 2 When the **Power off** menu appears, touch **OK**.

## **Turning Off the Screen**

If both the device and the screen are on, press the Power and Sleep/Wake button (a) once to turn off the screen.



**NOTE:** If the device is on, but the screen is off, press the Power and Sleep/Wake button on once to turn on the screen. For information on unlocking the screen, see "The Screen Lock Wallpaper" on page 39.

## **Touch Screen**

Your device has a multi-touch sensitive screen. You can touch the surface of the screen to operate the device.

#### **Finger Gestures**

- Scroll through Home screens, web pages, lists, entries, photo thumbnails, contacts, and so on.

#### Flick or swipe

Move your finger in a vertical or horizontal direction on the screen.



Quickly scroll through Home screens, web pages, lists, entries, photo thumbnails, contacts, and so on.

#### Zoom out

Move two fingers close together on the screen.

Reduce the view of an image or web page (zoom out).



#### Zoom in

Move two fingers apart on the screen. Enlarge the view of an image or web page (zoom in).



## Screen Orientation

For optimal viewing experience, the screen orientation changes automatically to portrait or landscape format depending on how you hold the device.

To modify the default rotating behavior, open the rotation settings by touching the Home button  $\bigcirc$   $\rightarrow$  **Apps** button  $\longrightarrow$ 

## Settings



→ Screen → Auto-rotate screen.

- To enable **Auto-rotate screen**, touch the setting option to select the check box . Once enabled, the screen orientation changes automatically when you rotate the device.
- To disable **Auto-rotate screen**, touch the setting option to clear the check box . Once disabled, the screen orientation locks in landscape format, and the orientation does not change when you rotate the device.



**NOTE:** Applications downloaded from the Android Market may not support automatic screen rotation to portrait or landscape format.

## Applications, Widgets, and Shortcuts

**Application** — Software which allows you to perform a specific task. Your device is preloaded with a variety of applications, and additional applications can be downloaded from the Android Market.

**Widget** — A small application which resides on the Home screen and provides guick and easy access to information. For example, the Facebook widget allows you to read posts on your wall and update your status.

**Shortcut** — A link that you can create on your Home screen to provide quicker access to an application, service, and so on.

#### **Home Screen**

When you turn on and unlock your device, or touch the Home button (a), the Home screen appears. You can start from the Home screen to access all the features of your device.


The Home screen is composed of five panels. On the central Home screen, flick left/right or touch the screen edges to see more Home screen panels. You can personalize the Home screen by adding your own shortcuts or widgets, or by displaying your favorite picture as the desktop wallpaper. For more information, see "Customizing Your Home Screen" on page 25.



- **1** Google Search Q Search your device and the web by typing.
- 2 Voice Search Search your device and the web by speaking.
- 3 Apps Open the Apps screen to find all the applications installed on your device.





The right side of the system bar displays notification icons, the current time, and status icons.




## **Managing Notifications**

- To view the details about a notification, touch a notification icon.
- To remove a notification, touch X.
- To view all your current notifications, touch the Time area to open the Notifications list. You can touch a notification summary to respond to it.



#### **Status Details**

- To view the details about the current date and time, network connections, and battery status, touch the Time area in the system bar to open the Status Details.
- To close the Status Details, touch any other part of the screen.



#### **Quick Settings**

The Quick Settings allow you to view or change the most common settings in your device conveniently.

- 1 Touch the Time area in the system bar to open the Status Details.
- 2 Touch anywhere in the Status Details. Then, the Quick Settings display below the Status Details.



View or change the desired settings.
To close the Quick Settings, touch any other part of the screen.

The Quick Settings include the following items:

- Airplane mode: Drag the switch to ON/OFF to enable/disable the Airplane mode. For more information, see "Disable All Connections Using the Airplane Mode" on page 66.
- **Wi-Fi**: Touch to open the **Wi-Fi settings**. For more information, see "Wi-Fi" on page 63.
- Auto-rotate screen: Drag the switch to ON/OFF to enable/disable the Auto-rotate screen feature. For more information, see "Screen Orientation" on page 17.
- Brightness: Drag the slider to change the brightness level of the screen. Or, you can touch AUTO to allow the device to set screen brightness automatically according to the amount of light in your surroundings.

- Notifications: Drag the switch to ON/OFF to enable/disable system or application notifications. When disabled, the icon appears. You can touch this icon to turn notifications back on.
- **Settings**: Touch to open Settings. For more information, see "Customizing Your Dell Streak 7 Tablet" on page 104.

## **Customizing Your Home Screen**

## Adding an Item to a Home Screen

- **1** Touch the Home button 圇.
- 2 Flick to a Home screen where you want to add the item.
- **3** Either touch and hold an empty area on a Home screen, or touch the Customize button at the top-right corner of a Home screen, until the following screen appears.



- 4 Items that can be added to a Home screen are divided into four categories. Touch a tab for the category of item you want to add, and flick the screen left or right to see more items, if available.
- **5** Do either one of the following:
  - Touch the item you want to add onto the current Home screen.
  - Touch and hold the item, and drag it onto a Home screen where you want to add it. If you pause before lifting your finger, the Home screen will enlarge, so you can drag to place the item on a specific position you want.

#### To add a widget to a Home screen

You can add widgets to display active Home screen windows or controls for your favorite applications or web-based services, such as an analog clock, the music player, the Google Search widget, or a calendar showing upcoming events.

You can also add Dell Stage widgets to provide direct access to your contacts, e-mail, pictures, music, Facebook & Twitter updates, frequently viewed websites, and recently used applications. For information on using Dell Stage widgets, see "The Dell Stage Widgets" on page 30.

- 1 Either touch and hold an empty area on a Home screen, or touch the Customize button # at the top-right corner of a Home screen.
- 2 Touch the Widgets tab.
- **3** Flick the screen left or right to locate the desired widget.
- 4 Touch and hold the desired widget, and drag it to a Home screen.

#### To add an application shortcut to a Home screen

You can create application shortcuts on a Home screen, so you can touch the icons to open the applications quickly, without opening the Apps screen first.

- 1 Either touch and hold an empty area on a Home screen, or touch the Customize button at the top-right corner of a Home screen.
- 2 Touch the **Apps** tab.
- **3** Flick the screen left or right to locate the desired application.
- **4** Touch and hold the desired application, and drag it to a Home screen to create the shortcut.

#### To change the wallpaper

To change the wallpaper of your Home screen, follow the steps below:

- 1 Either touch and hold an empty area on a Home screen, or touch the Customize button ## at the top-right corner of a Home screen.
- 2 Touch the Wallpapers tab.
- **3** Select a desired wallpaper from the categories below, and touch the wallpaper to set it as the wallpaper of your Home screen.
  - Gallery: Open available photo albums on the device or on the web. Select a picture from the albums. To cut a portion of the picture as the wallpaper, move the crop frame and drag the angles to select the desired part. Touch Ok to set the wallpaper.
  - **Live wallpapers**: Select an animated and interactive wallpaper, and then touch **Set wallpaper**.
  - **Wallpapers**: Touch a picture thumbnail to set it as the wallpaper.

#### To add more shortcuts to a Home screen

You can add more shortcuts for items that you want to access directly from the Home screen.

- 1 Either touch and hold an empty area on a Home screen, or touch the Customize button # at the top-right corner of a Home screen.
- 2 Touch the More tab.
- **3** Touch and hold the desired item, and drag it to a Home screen to create the shortcut.

A variety of items may be available as follows.

Bookmark	1 Flick through the Bookmarks list to locate the desired bookmark.	
	2 Touch the desired bookmark to create the shortcut on the Home screen.

	2 Choose how you want to get to your destination by touching the driving, public transportation, bicycle, or walking icon (from left to right).
	<b>3</b> Enter a name for the shortcut.
	<b>4</b> Touch the shortcut icon that you want to use for the shortcut.
	<b>5</b> Touch the <b>Save</b> button.

Latitude	Create a shortcut that you can touch to open Google Latitude to share locations with your friends and family who have signed in to the service with their Google accounts.
Music playlist	Create a <b>Play all</b> or a <b>Recently added</b> shortcut that you can touch to play all songs or recently added songs.
Select settings	Scroll through the settings to locate the desired setting.
	2 Touch the desired setting to create the shortcut on the Home screen, where you can touch the shortcut to access the setting.

## Adding an Application Shortcut from the Apps screen

- 1 Touch the Apps button **a** at the top-right of any Home screen to open the Apps screen.
- 2 On the Apps screen, touch and hold a desired application and drag it onto a Home screen. The application's icon appears on the Home screen.
- **NOTE:** If you pause before lifting your finger, the Home screen will enlarge, so you can drag to place the item on a specific position you want

#### Moving a Home Screen Item

- 1 Touch and hold the item you want to reposition until it becomes movable. The device vibrates to indicate that the item's moving mode is activated.
- **NOTE:** To disable the item's moving mode, release the item.
- 2 With your finger remaining in contact with the item on the screen, drag the item to another location on the screen.
- **3** Release the item in the desired location.

## Removing a Home Screen Item

- 1 Touch and hold an item such as a widget or shortcut that you want to remove, until it becomes movable.
- 2 Drag the item onto the top of the Trash icon



**3** When the item turns red, release your finger from the screen.

## The Dell Stage Widgets



**NOTE:** Availability and functionality of the Dell Stage widgets described in this section may vary depending on the software version pre-installed on your device. It is recommended to upgrade to the latest software version for full functionality.

The Dell Stage widgets give you direct access to the following items from the Home screen:

- Kindle Books (see "Using the Books Stage Widget" on page 31.)
- Photos and videos (see "Using the Photo Stage Widget" on page 32.)
- Streaming radio stations (see "Using the Radio Stage Widget" on page 33.)
- Facebook & Twitter applications (see "Using the Social Stage") Widget" on page 34.)
- Real-time weather information (see "Using the Weather Stage") Widget" on page 36.)
- Bookmarked or frequently viewed websites (see "Using the Web Stage Widget" on page 35.)

#### Adding a Stage Widget

You can create Stage widgets on free Home screens to access the desired items.

- 1 Navigate to a free Home screen where you want to add a Stage widget.
- 2 Touch and hold an empty area on a Home screen, or touch the Customize button **4** at the top-right corner of a Home screen.
- **3** Touch the **Widgets** tab.
- **4** Flick the screen left or right to locate the desired Stage widget.
- 5 Touch and hold the desired Stage widget, and drag it to a Home screen.

#### Removing a Stage Widget

- 1 Touch and hold a Stage widget that you want to remove from a Home screen, until it becomes movable.
- 2 Drag the Stage widget onto the top of the Trash icon



**3** When the Stage widget turns red, release your finger from the screen.

#### **Using the Books Stage Widget**

From the **Books** Stage widget, you can view the following book categories:

- MY BOOKS & MAGAZINES (Kindle books stored on your device)
- NEW RELEASES
- TOP PAID BOOKS
- TOP FREE BOOKS
- BEST SELLING MAGAZINES




- 1 Touch to open the Kindle application.
- 2 Touch to enter the **BOOKS SETTINGS** mode.
- 3 Drag or flick through the rows of the book tiles, and then touch a book tile to open the browser to the Kindle website at the book detail page.

# To select the book categories to display on the Books Stage widget

- 1 Touch ( to enter the BOOKS SETTINGS mode.
- 2 Touch vo select the categories.
- 3 Touch when you have completed the settings.

## **Using the Photo Stage Widget**

The **Photo** Stage widget displays the most recent photos and videos captured using the Camera application or stored in the "DCIM" folder on your device. Photos from the Facebook feed will be displayed as well once you have signed in to your Facebook account.




- Drag or flick through the photo or video thumbnails.
  - Touch the thumbnail of a photo stored on the device to open the photo in the Gallery or the PhotoStage application.
  - Touch the thumbnail of a photo from the Facebook feed to open Facebook to the message where the photo was originally posted.
  - Touch the thumbnail of a video stored on the device to start playing the video.
- 2 Touch to open the Gallery application.
- Touch to enter the PHOTOS SETTINGS mode.

Touch to open the Camera application and capture a new photo or video.

## **Using the Radio Stage Widget**

The **Radio** Stage widget displays a list of user presets or recently played streaming radio stations from the TuneIn Radio application.



- 1 The now-playing area displays the currently playing or last played station.
- Touch to search for a radio station by typing keyword, such as its location or genre.
- 3 Touch to open the Tuneln Radio application.
- 4 Touch to enter the **RADIO SETTINGS** mode.
- 5 Drag or flick through the list of radio stations, and then touch a station to open the TuneIn Radio application and tune in to the selected station.

#### **Using the Social Stage Widget**

The **Social** Stage widget displays your friends' latest postings retrieved from your Twitter or Facebook account. To use the Twitter and Facebook widgets, you need to sign in to your Twitter or Facebook account with your e-mail address and password.



**NOTE:** You can access both your Facebook and Twitter accounts from one Social Stage widget. To do so, go to **SOCIAL SETTINGS**, and select the Twitter and Facebook check boxes to enable them.



- 1 Touch to manually update the message feeds.

#### Using the Web Stage Widget

The **Web** Stage widget displays thumbnails of bookmarked websites or the most visited websites.



- Drag or flick through the thumbnails of web pages. Touch a web page thumbnail to load the web page in the Browser application.

- 4 Touch to find the desired web page using Google Search.

#### To choose between viewing bookmarks or frequent sites

- 2 To display all the available bookmarks in this widget view, touch Bookmarks. To display only the most frequently visited sites, touch Most Visited Sites.

#### To refresh web page thumbnails automatically

- 1 Touch ( to enter the WEB SETTINGS mode.
- 2 Touch Update Thumbnails.
- **NOTE:** For more information on using the Browser application, see "Browsing the Internet" on page 66.

#### **Using the Weather Stage Widget**

The **Weather** Stage widget provides real-time weather information and 5 day weather forecast from AccuWeather.



- 1 Touch 🖔 to manually update the weather information.
- Displays the date.
  - Touch to open the Calendar application.
- Touch to open the browser and visit **AccuWeather.com** to see more weather information
- 4 Touch to enter the **WEATHER SETTINGS** mode.
  - My Agenda: When this option is enabled, your agenda from the Calendar application will be displayed in this widget view.
  - 5 Day Forecast: When this option is enabled, 5 day weather forecast will be displayed in this widget view.
- 5 Displays 5 day weather forecast of your current location, which is detected by wireless networks or GPS satellites automatically, depending on your settings. Touch to visit AccuWeather.com to see more weather forecast.
- 6 Displays the weather information of your current location. Touch to visit **AccuWeather.com** to see more details.

#### To display the weather information for a different location

- 1 Touch ( to enter the **WEATHER SETTINGS** mode.
- 2 Touch Current Location.
- **3** Enter a city or postal code in the search box and touch Select the desired location from the search results.
- **NOTE:** To change the temperature unit that the widget uses to display weather, touch **F** or **C**.

# **Navigating the Applications**

You can find applications available on your device in these screen elements:

## Apps screen

The Apps screen can be accessed from any Home screen and contains all of the applications installed on the device, including those you have downloaded from the Android Market.

#### To open the Apps screen

- 2 From any of the desktop Home screens, touch the **Apps** button

#### To navigate pages of applications

Flick the Apps screen horizontally and touch an application to run it.

#### To close the Apps screen

To return to the last Home screen you viewed, touch the Home button an on the device or the Home button on the screen. To return to the central Home screen, touch a or again.

## **Application Shortcuts**

To quickly launch applications on the Home screen, you can add shortcuts for frequently-used applications to the Home screen. For more information, see "Customizing Your Home Screen" on page 25.

#### To open an application using the application shortcuts

- 1 Touch the Home button (a).
- 2 If the desired application shortcut displays on the Home screen, touch the shortcut to run the application.

## **Recent Applications**

#### To open a recently used application

- 1 Touch the Recent Applications button **to** view the recently used applications.
- **2** Scroll the list of recently used applications, and touch the desired application thumbnail to run the application.
- **NOTE:** To close the list of recently used applications, touch the Close button ...

## The Screen Lock Wallpaper

You can set the display to turn off automatically after a timeout period of inactivity, or turn it off manually by pressing the power button .

When you press the power button **(a)** to wake up the display, the screen lock wallpaper appears to help prevent unintentional touch of the screen.

When the screen lock wallpaper appears, touch and hold the lock icon 

B. When it turns into a circle, drag it to the edge of the larger circle that surrounds it to unlock the screen.



NOTE: To set the duration the screen remains on before turning off after the last operation, touch the Home button (a) → Apps button Settings→ Screen→ Timeout.



# **Managing Contacts**

To view and manage your contacts, touch the Home button  $\textcircled{a} \rightarrow$ 

#### To add a new contact

- 1 Touch In New.
- 2 Select the account where you want to add this contact, such as your Gmail account.



- 1 This area shows the account in which the new contact is stored.
- Take photo: Touch to take a photo to use as the contact's visual caller ID.
  - Select photo from Gallery: Touch to select a photo from the Gallery application to use as the contact's visual caller ID.
- **3** Enter the contact information using the on-screen keyboard. Scroll the screen to find more items to fill.

- 4 Touch to replace a default information label with another label that you can choose from the list. For example, you can change the label from **Home** phone number to **Mobile** phone number.
- 5 Touch to add a new item to the current information category. For example, you can add a second phone number.
- **6** Touch to remove an item from the current information category.
- 7 Touch to fill more information about the contact.
- **8** Touch to display more options.
- **9** Touch **Cancel** to return to your Contacts list.
- 10 Touch **Done** to save the new contact to your Contacts list.
- 11 Touch to return to your Contacts list.

#### To find a contact

- 1 To locate a contact, you can either:
  - Flick the Contacts list until you find the contact. Or, drag the scroll bar on the left of the screen to scroll through the Contacts list.
  - Touch **Find contacts**, and then type either the contact's full name or only the first letters of it into the text box. The screen displays the matching contacts.
- 2 Once the contact is located, touch the contact's entry to view the contact's details.

#### To e-mail or send a message to a contact

- **1** On the Contacts list, find a desired contact.
- 2 Touch the contact entry to view the contact details, and then touch to send e-mail using the e-mail accounts you have set up on your device, or touch to send a message.

#### To edit a contact

- 1 On the Contacts list, find a desired contact.
- 2 Touch the contact entry to view the contact details.
- **3** Touch to edit the contact details.
- 4 Touch **Done** to save the changes.

#### To share a contact

- 1 On the Contacts list, find a desired contact.
- 2 Touch the contact entry to view the contact details.
- **3** Touch the Menu button 

  on the device or the Menu button 

  on the screen → **Share contact**.
- **4** From the **Share contact via** menu that appears, select the way you want to share the contact information with your friends, such as through e-mail or Bluetooth.

#### To join contacts

Since your device can synchronize with a variety of accounts, when synchronizing contacts from these accounts with your device, you may have multiple contacts for the same person.

Joining contacts allows you to view all the contact's numbers, addresses, and so on, in one single contact entry.

- **1** On the Contacts list, find a desired contact.
- 2 Touch the contact entry to view the contact details, and then touch ...
- **3** Touch the Menu button on the device or the Menu button on the screen **Join**.
- **4** From the **Join contacts** list, touch another contact to link, and then touch **Done**.

The joined contact's information is displayed with the original contact's information.



**NOTE:** To separate the previously joined contacts, touch the contact entry $\rightarrow$   $\nearrow$   $\rightarrow$   $\equiv$   $\rightarrow$  Separate $\rightarrow$  OK.

#### **Contacts settings**



In **Contacts** , touch the Menu button (a) on the device or the

Adjust the display options for your contacts.
Contacts stored on your device can be synchronized with a computer using Dell Mobile Sync; contacts stored on your personal e-mail account such as Gmail can be synchronized through an Internet connection.
<ul> <li>To select the data to synchronize:</li> <li>Select Background data to make all the sync options available.</li> </ul>
2 Select Auto-sync to let the device automatically synchronize the selected data in your Twitter account or e-mail account, which may include Twitter contacts and data, or Calendar, Contacts, Gmail, and Picasa Web Albums data.
• To select the data to sync from your e-mail account:

# Messaging (on 3G model only)

To compose, send, and read text (SMS) or multimedia (MMS) messages, touch the Home button  $\textcircled{a} \rightarrow \textbf{Apps}$  button

Messaging . The Messaging screen opens with a list of

messages or message threads representing all the received, sent, and draft messages.



**NOTE:** For information about the message thread, see "Receiving text and multimedia messages" on page 48.

#### To compose and send a text message

- 1 On the Messaging screen, touch the **New message** thread. The composer screen opens.
- 2 In the To field, type the mobile phone number or the contact name of the recipient. As you type a phone number or contact name, matching contacts with their mobile numbers appear below the To field. Touch a matched contact to enter the contact's mobile number, or continue typing the desired phone number.
- **3** Repeat step 2 to enter more mobile numbers if you want to send the message to multiple mobile phone users.
- **4** Touch the **Type to compose** text field to start composing your message.
- **5** Touch the **Send** button to send the text message.
- **6** To start a text conversation similar to online instant messaging, you can continue to compose and send messages to the same recipient(s). All of the sent and received messages between you and recipient(s) appear in the form of chat logs.

#### To compose and send a multimedia message

- 1 In the To field, type the recipient's mobile phone number, e-mail address, or contact name. Matching contacts with their mobile numbers or e-mail addresses appear below the To field. Touch a matched contact, or continue typing the desired phone number or e-mail address.
- 2 If you want to add a subject line to the message, touch the Menu button 

  on the device or the Menu button 

  note on the screen→

  Add subject.
- **3** Touch the **Type to compose** text field to start composing your message.
- 4 While editing your message, you can touch the Menu button ⊜ on the device or the Menu button ≡ on the screen → Attach to insert media items into the message. See the following table for more information.
- **5** When you have completed editing the multimedia message, touch the **Send MMS** button to send the message.

You can attach any of the following items to a multimedia message:

Open the <b>Gallery</b> application and touch a picture file to attach it to your message.
Open the <b>Camera</b> application to capture a picture, and then attach it to your message. For more information about the Camera application, see "Camera" on page 114.
Open the <b>Gallery</b> application and touch a video clip to attach it to your message.
Open the <b>Camera</b> application to capture a video clip in camcorder mode, and then attach it to your message. For more information about using the camcorder feature, see "To start the camcorder mode" on page 115.
Open the <b>Select music track</b> menu. Touch a desired audio file, and then touch <b>OK</b> to attach the file to your message.

#### Slideshow

Open the **Edit slideshow** screen to create a slide show and attach it to your message.

- 1 Touch Add slide to create new slides.
- 2 Touch a created slide such as **Slide 1** to open the slideshow editor screen.
- **3** Touch **Add picture**, and then select the picture you want to add to the slide.
- **4** You can touch the text field at the bottom of the screen to compose a caption for the displayed slide.
- 5 Touch the Menu button (a) on the device or the Menu button (b) on the screen to preview the slide, remove the picture, add music to the current slide, add a new slide, or change the slide duration or the text and picture layout.
- **6** When editing multiple slides, touch to edit the next slide; touch to return to the previous slide.

**NOTE:** You can create a slideshow of up to ten slides.

- 7 To replace a picture, on the slideshow editor screen, touch the Replace picture button and select a new picture to replace. To remove the current slide, touch the Remove slide button. To preview the slideshow, touch the Preview button.
- **8** When complete, touch the **Done** button to attach the slideshow to your message.
- **9** On the message composer screen, touch the slideshow attachment icon to play back the slide show; touch **Edit** to modify the slideshow.

#### Receiving text and multimedia messages

Depending on your notification settings, the device rings, vibrates, or displays a message briefly in the Status area of the system bar as a new text or multimedia message is received.

A new message icon appears and stays in the notifications area of the system bar to remind you of a new message.



**NOTE:** To alter the notification settings for new messages, in the Messaging application, touch the Menu button (a) on the device or the Menu button  $\equiv$  on the screen  $\rightarrow$  **Settings**. Scroll the screen to locate the Notifications settings section. You can then decide whether to display a text notification in the Status area of the system bar when a new message arrives, select a ringtone that rings on the arrival of a new message, or let the device vibrate to notify a new message.

Text and multimedia messages that are sent to and received from the same contact or a number are grouped into message threads similar to text conversations of an online chat. You can see all of the messages exchanged between you and the contact. Message threads are listed according to when they are sent or received, with the latest message at the top.

#### To read a text message

- When a new text message arrives, the new text message icon appears in the notifications area of the system bar. Touch the icon to open and read the message in the **Messaging** application.
- Touch the Home button  $\textcircled{a} \rightarrow \textbf{Apps}$  button  $\longrightarrow$ to open the message list, and then touch a text Messaging message or message thread to open and read it.

#### If the message includes a:

- Website link touch the link to open the Browser application and visit the website.
- E-mail address touch the e-mail address to open the Email/Gmail application and compose an e-mail to send to the address.

#### To forward the message

- 1 Touch and hold the message. The **Message options** menu pops up.
- **2** Select **Forward** to forward the message.

#### To view a multimedia message

1 When a new multimedia message arrives, the new multimedia message icon appears in the notifications area of the system bar. Touch the icon to open and read the message in the Messaging application.

Or

Touch the Home button  $\textcircled{a} \rightarrow \mathbf{Apps}$  button  $\longrightarrow$ 

**Messaging** to open the message list, and then touch a multimedia message or message thread to open the message.

- 2 Touch the thumbnail of the attached picture to display the picture; touch the **Play** button to play the attached video.
- **NOTE:** To save the attached media item to your device, touch and hold the message until the **Message options** menu opens. Touch **Save** attachment

#### To reply to a text or multimedia message

- 1 Touch a message or message thread to open it.
- 2 Type your reply message into the **Type to compose** text field.
- **3** Touch **Send** to send your message to the sender.

#### To delete a message or a message thread

- 1 In the Messaging list, touch and hold the message thread that you want to delete.
- 2 To delete the entire thread, touch **Delete thread** and then touch **Delete** to confirm deletion.
  - To delete a message within a thread, touch and hold the message to delete, and then touch **Delete message** on the **Message options** menu. Touch **Delete** to confirm deletion.
- NOTE: To delete all messages in the Messaging list, touch the Menu button 

  on the device or the Menu button 

  on the screen→ Delete all threads.

#### To edit message settings

In the **Messaging** application, touch the Menu button  $\textcircled{\equiv}$  on the device or the Menu button  $\textcircled{\equiv}$  on the screen  $\rightarrow$  **Settings**. Follow the instructions on the screen to change the text or multimedia message settings.

## Pop-up Menu

Touch the Menu button 
on the device or the Menu button 
on the screen to open or close the pop-up menu that lists available options for the current application, or actions that you can perform on the current screen.

#### To select an option or item on the pop-up menu

- 1 Touch the Menu button ⊜ on the device or the Menu button ≡ on the screen to open the pop-up menu.
- 2 Touch the desired item on the pop-up menu.

# Swype Keyboard

The Swype keyboard allows you to enter text by drawing a path through the letters of a word, instead of touching each key to type the word. The keyboard automatically rotates to either the portrait or landscape mode based on the device orientation.

#### To set the Swype keyboard as the input keyboard

- 1 Touch the Home button  $\textcircled{a} \rightarrow \mathsf{Apps}$  button  $\Longrightarrow \rightarrow$  Settings  $\longrightarrow \mathsf{Language} \ \& \ \mathsf{input}.$
- 2 Touch Current input method under the Keyboard settings section.
- 3 On the **Select input method** menu that appears, touch **Swype**.


#### To open the Swype keyboard

Touch a text box to open the Swype keyboard.

#### To close the Swype keyboard

Touch the Back button  $\odot$  on the device or the Close button  $\bigcirc$  on the screen to close the Swype keyboard.

#### Swype Keyboard controls for composing an e-mail



1 To enter the word "Need" for example, place your finger on the first letter "N" and glide to the following letters. Lift your finger after the last letter "d". The keyboard predicts and enters the word according to the letters that the path you drew goes through. Letters irrelevant to the spelling of the word are ignored.

**NOTE:** You can still touch each key to type a word.

- 2 To enter the same letter twice, for example, "ee" for the word "Need", do a quick back-and-forth scribble or draw a loop on the letter "e".

  - To find more symbols available from this key, touch and hold the key until the symbols appear, and then touch the symbol you want to type.
- Touch to enter a space.
  - Touch and hold and then release to enter a tab space.
- 7 Touch to enter "•".
  - Touch and hold and then release to enter "".
  - To find more symbols available from this key, touch and hold the key until the symbols appear, and then touch the symbol you want to type.
- Touch to delete a typed character, symbol, or a space.
  - Touch and hold to quickly delete typed text.
- 9 ENTER key.
- To type the number or symbol displayed on the key, touch and hold the key, and when the number or symbol appears release the key.
  - To find more symbols available from the same key, touch and hold the key until the symbols appear, and then touch the symbol you want to type.
- 11 The Swype keyboard displays word suggestions when it cannot predict the word according to the trace you draw.

# Creating your personal dictionary in the Swype keyboard

The Swype keyboard uses the default dictionary to display suggested words as you type. You can create a personal dictionary to include words not found in the main dictionary. The keyboard will also look at the words that are added to your personal dictionary to make word suggestions.

#### To add a word to the Swype dictionary

- **3** Edit the spelling of the word in the text box.

#### To delete a word from the Swype dictionary

- 1 Repeat Step 1 to 4 in "To add a word to the Swype dictionary" to open **Personal dictionary**.
- 2 Touch \_\_\_\_.
- **3** Select one or more words that you want to delete by touching the check box ...
- 4 Touch to confirm deletion.

# **Dell Keyboard**

#### To search by voice

- **1** Touch  $\emptyset$  that appears beside the search box.
- 2 Say the name or keyword of the item you want to search.
- **3** The browser with matching web links opens.
- **NOTE:** You can also access the Voice Search function by touching the Home button  $\textcircled{a} \rightarrow \textbf{Apps}$  button  $\overset{\bullet}{\blacksquare} \rightarrow \textbf{Voice Search}$   $\overset{\bullet}{\blacksquare}$ .


#### To erase unwanted application data to free storage space

- 2 Touch the application whose cache or data you want to remove.
- **3** Touch **Clear data** under **Storage** to erase unwanted application data; touch **Clear cache** under **Cache** to erase unwanted cache.

#### To remove the SD card safely

- CAUTION: Removing the SD card while the device is working may cause data loss or result in application errors.
- CAUTION: It is strongly recommended that you unmount the SD card before removing it.
- 1 Touch the Home button  $\textcircled{a} \rightarrow Apps$  button  $\longrightarrow$  Settings  $\longrightarrow$  Storage.
- 2 Touch Unmount SD card under the SD Card section.
- **3** Press and hold the Power and Sleep/Wake button **6** until the **Power off** menu appears. Then, touch **OK** to turn off the device.



To browse the web and access web-based utilities such as instant messaging, one of the following data networking connections must be available:

- GPRS
- EDGE
- 3G
- HSPA
- Wi-Fi

## GPRS/EDGE/3G/HSPA (on 3G model only)

#### To connect to the Internet using GPRS, EDGE, 3G, or HSPA

Your device is configured with the GPRS, EDGE, 3G, or HSPA network available with the service provider of the SIM card installed in your device. However, this is only limited to text messaging. If a Wi-Fi connection is currently available, the device automatically uses the Wi-Fi connection to access the Internet. The Internet connection through GPRS, EDGE, 3G, or HSPA becomes temporarily inactive, until the Wi-Fi connection ends.

If you want to connect to the Internet using a GPRS, EDGE, 3G, or HSPA data network:

- 1 Touch the Home button  $\bigcirc \rightarrow Apps$  button  $\longrightarrow Apps$ 
  - Settings → Wireless & networks, then touch Wi-Fi to clear
  - the check box to disable it.
- 2 Touch Mobile networks. On the Mobile network settings menu that appears, touch Data enabled to enable it.



NOTE: Depending on whether a GPRS, EDGE, 3G, or HSPA network is currently in use, a corresponding data network icon appears on the status bar after a data connection is established.

You can set the device to search for available networks if you are outside your home network or want to register to a different network.

#### To manually select a new network

1 Touch the Home button  $\bigcirc \rightarrow Apps$  button  $\longrightarrow \rightarrow$ 



Network operators. The list of networks currently available is displayed.

2 Touch to select a network from the Available networks list.

#### To automatically select a new network

1 Touch the Home button  $\bigcirc \rightarrow Apps$  button  $\longrightarrow \rightarrow$ Settings → Wireless & networks → Mobile networks.

2 Touch Select automatically from the Available networks list.

#### Wi-Fi

You can connect your device to the Internet using Wi-Fi.

To connect to a Wi-Fi network, you need access to a wireless point or "hotspot" within a distance of up to 300 feet (91.44 meters).



**NOTE:** The range and quality of the Wi-Fi signal is affected by the number of connected devices, infrastructure, and objects through which the signal is transmitted.

#### To turn on Wi-Fi and connect to a network

1 Touch the Home button  $\bigcirc$   $\rightarrow$  Apps button  $\longrightarrow$ 



Wi-Fi check box. The device scans for available wireless networks.

- 2 Touch Wi-Fi settings. The network names and security settings (Open network or Secured with WEP/WPA/WPA2/WPS) of discovered Wi-Fi networks display in the Wi-Fi networks list.
- **3** Flick the list and touch to select a Wi-Fi network you want to connect to.
- **4** Enter a password (if necessary), then touch **Connect** to connect to the Wi-Fi network.
- NOTE: To connect to a network protected by Wired Equivalent Privacy (WEP), Wi-Fi Protected Access (WPA), WPA2, or Wireless Protected Setup (WPS), you must enter the WEP/WPA/WPA2/WPS security key to obtain authorized access to the network. The next time your device connects to a previously accessed secured wireless network, you will not be required to enter the WEP/WPA/WPA2/WPS key again, unless you reset your device to its factory default settings.
- **NOTE:** Your device has the ability to maintain a constant Internet connection through Wi-Fi or data networks (GPRS, EDGE, 3G, or HSPA). However, Wi-Fi connection has priority over mobile network connection if both are available.

#### To check the current Wi-Fi network connection

From the status area of the system bar:

#### From the Wi-Fi network:

1 Touch the Home button  $\bigcirc \rightarrow Apps$  button  $\longrightarrow \rightarrow$ 

Settings → Wireless & networks → Wi-Fi settings.

- 2 Touch the Wi-Fi network that the device is currently connected to (labeled **Connected**). A window opens displaying the Wi-Fi network's name, status, security information, signal strength, link speed, and IP address.
- **NOTE:** If you want to disconnect the Wi-Fi network from your device, touch **Forget** on this window. You will need to configure the Wi-Fi settings again if you want to restore connection to this wireless network.

#### To connect to another Wi-Fi network

1 Touch the Home button  $\bigcirc \rightarrow Apps$  button  $\longrightarrow Apps$ 

Settings → Wireless & networks → Wi-Fi settings. The detected Wi-Fi networks are displayed in the Wi-Fi networks list.

- NOTE: To start a new search for available Wi-Fi networks, on the Wi-Fi settings screen, touch the Menu button 

  on the device or the Menu button 

  on the screen→ Scan.
- 2 Flick through the **Wi-Fi networks** list and touch the name of the network you want to connect to.
- **NOTE:** If the wireless network you want to connect to is not in the list of detected networks, flick to the bottom of the list to touch **Add Wi-Fi network**. Enter the Wi-Fi network settings, and then touch **Save**.

## Disable All Connections Using the Airplane Mode

Selecting the Airplane mode disables all mobile, Bluetooth, and Wi-Fi connections. This feature is useful when wireless connectivity is strictly prohibited, such as on an airplane.


- 1 Touch the Time area in the system bar to open the Status Details.
- **2** Touch anywhere in the Status Details. Then, the Quick Settings display below the Status Details.
- **3** Drag the switch to **ON** to enable the Airplane mode; drag the switch to **OFF** to disable the Airplane mode;

#### To open the browser

Touch the Home button  $\textcircled{a} \rightarrow Apps$  button  $\Longrightarrow Browser$ .

#### To use the browser controls bar

- 2 Touch to open a new browser window and display the home page under a new tab.

- - New tab: Open a web page in a new window under a new tab.
  - **New incognito tab**: Open a web page in a new window under a new tab, and the pages you view in this new window will not appear in your browsing history or search history. Read the on-screen instructions for more information.
  - Find on page: Search for contents on the current web page.
  - **Share page**: Send the web page URL using Bluetooth, Gmail, and so on.
  - Save page: Save the web page to **Downloads**.
  - Page info: View information about the current web page.
  - Downloads: View and manage recent downloads.
  - **Settings**: Access advanced settings to customize the **Browser** application.
- 4 Touch to open **Bookmarks** and **History** windows.
  - **Bookmarks**: Display bookmarked websites. Scroll to view all bookmarks and touch an entry to open the website.
  - History: Display browsing history and the most visited web pages.
     To view the history, select a page, such as Today, Yesterday, Last 7 days, Last month, Most visited, and so on.
- **5** Touch to find the desired web page using Google Search or Voice Search.
- **6** Touch to bookmark the current web page.
- 7 Touch the web page address field and type the address of the web page you want to go to.
- 8 Touch to refresh the current web page.
- **9** Touch to view the next web page.
- **10** Touch to view the previous web page.

#### To go to a web page

- 1 On the browser screen, touch the web page address field on the screen.
- 2 Type the web page address using the on-screen keyboard. As you type the address, matching web page addresses appear.
- **3** Touch an address displayed on the screen to go directly to that web page.

#### To set up your home page

To manually enter a home page:

- 1 Touch the Menu button ⊜ on the device or the Menu button ≡ on the screen→ Settings→ Set homepage.
- **2** Enter the address of the website you want to use as your home page and then touch **OK**.

To set the current page as the home page:

- **1** Go to the web page that you want to set as the home page.

To select a home page from bookmarks:

## **Viewing Web Pages**

#### To navigate on a web page

Flick your finger horizontally or vertically on the screen to scroll and view desired areas of a web page.

#### To zoom in on a web page

Pinch-out a desired area of a web page by moving two fingers apart on the screen.

#### To zoom out on a web page

Pinch-in a desired area of a web page by bringing two fingers closer together on the screen.



**NOTE:** You can also double-tap the desired area of a web page to switch between the zoom-in and zoom-out views of the area.

#### To view the next or previous web page

- From the browser controls bar, touch to view the previous web page; touch to view the next web page.
- Touch the Back button ⊕ on the device to view the previous web page.


#### To open a new browser window

- From the browser controls bar, touch to open a new browser window and display the home page under a new tab.
   Or
- Touch the Menu button ⊜ on the device or the Menu button □ on the screen→ **New tab**. A new browser window opens and displays the home page under a new tab.

#### To switch between browser windows

You can open multiple browser windows. Touch the tabs to easily switch from one web page to another.






#### To find text within a web page

#### To copy text on a web page

You can copy and paste text from a web page to your e-mail or text messages.

- 2 Locate the text you want to copy, and then touch and hold the text until the **Text selection** action bar appears on the top of the screen.



4 Release your finger from the screen.

5 Touch Copy to copy the selected text to the clipboard first. To paste the copied text to an e-mail or text message, open the application. Touch and hold the text field on a message or e-mail screen, and then touch Paste on the context menu.

Move to a link you want on a web page. The link is framed by a highlighted box when you touch it.

You need to sign in to a Google account to use Google applications and services such as Gmail, Google Talk, and Android Market. Signing in to your Google account also synchronizes all e-mails, contacts, and calendar on your Google account with your device.



- 1 On the **Sign in with your Google Account** screen, type your Google user name and password, and then touch the Sign in button to proceed.
- **NOTE:** Touch **Create an account now** if you do not have a Google account.
- **NOTE:** Touch the Menu button (a) on the device or the Menu button  $\equiv$  on the screen  $\rightarrow$  **Browser sign-in**, if you want to sign in to a Google account using the **Browser** application.
- 2 Touch **Done** to complete the process.
- NOTE: Signing in to your Google Account requires an Internet connection. Ensure that your device has an active Wi-Fi or mobile data connection (GPRS, EDGE, 3G, or HSPA) before you sign in. For more information on setting up a data connection, see "Connecting to the Internet" on page 62.

Your Gmail inbox opens as the default Gmail view. All your received emails are delivered to your inbox.



- 1 Touch to select an Gmail account if you have set up multiple accounts on your device.
- 2 Folder (or Label) and number of unread e-mails.


To view e-mails stored in the folders other than the **Inbox**, such as in the **Sent** or **All Mail** folder, or to view labeled or starred e-mails, touch the folder that stores the e-mails you want to view.

  - Change labels: Change label for the selected item.

- **9** Touch to search for e-mails.

#### To read e-mails

- When you receive a new e-mail in the **Gmail** application, the e-mail icon appears in the notifications area of the system bar to alert you of a new e-mail. Touch the icon to open the new e-mail to view it in the **Gmail** application.
- While in the inbox or in any other folder, scroll the e-mail threads on the screen, and then touch an e-mail thread to view the emails inside.

- 2 Touch to read the previous e-mail thread.
- **3** Touch **Reply** to reply to the contact.
- 4 Touch **Reply all** to reply to all contacts in the mail loop.
- 5 Touch **Forward** to forward the e-mail to another contact.
- **6** Touch to star an e-mail. To check the starred e-mails, go to the **Starred** folder.

7 Touch to view previous e-mails with the same subject.

#### To create and send an e-mail

- 2 Select an e-mail account to use if you have set up more than one account on your device.
- 3 In an e-mail account inbox, touch 📉 to compose an e-mail.
- **4** Type the contact's e-mail address in the **To** field. To send e-mail to multiple contacts, separate their e-mail addresses with a comma.
- **5** Type the e-mail subject.
- 6 Compose your e-mail. To attach a picture in your e-mail, touch the icon. Select the picture you want to attach from the Gallery application.
  - **NOTE:** Touch X to remove an attachment.
- 7 Touch **Send** to send the e-mail.

# Google Talk

Google Talk is an instant messaging program provided by Google.

## To activate Google Talk

- 1 Touch the Home button  $\textcircled{a} \rightarrow Apps$  button  $\longrightarrow Talk$
- 2 Touch Sign in to sign in Google Talk with your Google account. If you do not have a Google account, follow the instructions on the screen to create an account (see "To set up your Google account" on page 80).
- **3** The Google Talk window opens with your friends list.

#### To sign in automatically

You can sign in to your Google Talk account automatically whenever you turn on the device.

- 1 In the friends list, touch the Menu button 

  on the device or the Menu button 

  on the screen → Settings.
- 2 Select the Sign in automatically check box.

#### To add a new friend to your friends list

- **NOTE:** You can only add users who have a Google Account.
  - 1 In the friends list, touch the \_\_\_\_ icon to add a friend.
- **2** Enter the Google Talk instant messaging ID or Gmail address of the friend you want to add to your friends list.
- **NOTE:** When you type the instant messaging ID of a friend who is already a contact saved in Contacts with the same ID, this matching contact will display on the screen before you finish typing. You can touch the contact whose ID is then entered automatically.
  - 3 Touch Send invitation

#### To view and accept an invitation

- 1 When receiving a chat invitation, the pop-up **Accept invitation** menu appears.
- 2 Touch Accept, Decline, or Block.

#### To change your online status and message

- **3** To enter your status message, touch the **Status message** field. When the **Status message** text box opens, enter your message.
- 4 To change your ID photo, touch the photo icon to capture a picture or select a photo to use from the **Gallery** application.

#### To start a conversation

- **2** Type your message in the text box.
- **3** Touch the to send the message.

#### To add a friend to an active conversation

- 1 On the chat screen, close the on-screen keyboard, and then touch the icon→ Add to chat.
- **2** Select the friend you want to invite to the current conversation.

#### To disable the chat log

- 1 On the chat screen, close the on-screen keyboard, and then touch the icon→ Go off the record.
- 2 The subsequent chat conversations will not be recorded. To resume the chat log, touch **Stop chatting off the record**.



- **NOTE:** As you enter information, previous searches or matching locations appear below the search box. You can touch a place name or address to show the location on the map.







- **3** Enter the password you have enabled.
- **4** Select **Not secured** to disable the PIN; select **Password** to change the password.

## Protect Your SIM Card with the SIM Lock Password (on 3G model only)

You can protect your SIM card against unauthorized use with a personal identification number (PIN). After a PIN is enabled to lock your SIM, you will need to enter the PIN each time you turn on the device in order to unlock your SIM.



**NOTE:** The SIM card will be permanently locked if you enter the incorrect PIN for three consecutive times. You must then enter the Personal Unblocking Key (PUK) to unlock the SIM card. Contact your service provider to obtain the PUK.

#### To enable the SIM card PIN

- 1 Touch the Home button  $\bigcirc \rightarrow Apps$  button  $\longrightarrow \rightarrow$ Settings → Location & security.
- 2 Touch Set up SIM card lock under the SIM card lock section
- 3 Touch Lock SIM card on the SIM card lock settings menu that appears.
- **4** Type your SIM card PIN, and then touch **OK**.

## To change the SIM card PIN


## Camera

Your device has a camera with auto-focus feature that allows you to capture and share high-quality pictures and videos.

## To start the camera in picture mode

Touch the Home button  $\textcircled{a} \rightarrow Apps$  button  $\Longrightarrow \rightarrow Camera$ 

#### Camera controls



- 1 Viewfinder screen
- 2 Touch the thumbnail view of the last taken picture to view and manage the picture using the **Gallery** application.
- **3** Switch between the front-facing camera and the rear-facing camera.
- **4** Drag this on-screen switch to toggle between the camera mode for capturing pictures, and the camcorder mode for capturing videos.

**5** On-screen shutter button.


To capture a picture:

## To start the camcorder mode

Touch **to** switch to the camcorder screen.

#### Camcorder controls



- 1 Viewfinder screen.
- 2 Touch the thumbnail view of the last captured video to play and manage the video using the **Gallery** application.
- **3** Switch between the front-facing camcorder and the rear-facing camcorder.
- **4** Drag this on-screen switch to toggle between the camera mode for capturing pictures, and the camcorder mode for shooting videos.
- 5 To start or stop recording, touch this on-screen video recording button.

- 6 Camcorder setting indicator. Touch each indicator to open the camcorder settings.
- **7** Zoom-in.
- 8 Zoom-out.

## Bluetooth®

Bluetooth is a short-range wireless communications technology that allows your device to connect to other Bluetooth-enabled devices over a wireless network.

Bluetooth on your device operates in three different modes:

On	Bluetooth is turned on. Your device is enabled to detect Bluetooth devices within range, but will not be found by them.
Discoverable	Bluetooth is turned on, and other Bluetooth devices can detect your device.
Off	Bluetooth is turned off. Your device cannot send and receive data using Bluetooth.

## To turn on Bluetooth and make the device discoverable

- 1 Touch the Home button  $\textcircled{a} \rightarrow \mathsf{Apps}$  button  $\longrightarrow$  Settings  $\longrightarrow$  Wireless & networks.
- 2 Select the Bluetooth check box to turn on Bluetooth. The Bluetooth icon appears in the status area of the system bar.
- 3 Touch Bluetooth settings, then select the Discoverable check box to make the device recognizable by other nearby Bluetooth devices.

## To pair with a Bluetooth device

1 Touch the Home button  $\bigcirc \rightarrow Apps$  button  $\longrightarrow \rightarrow$ 

Settings  $\longrightarrow$  Wireless & networks $\rightarrow$  Bluetooth settings.

- **NOTE:** Ensure Bluetooth has been enabled on the device you want to pair with, and the device is in Discoverable state.
- 2 Touch **Find nearby devices**. Your device starts to scan for Bluetooth devices within range and then displays all detected devices below the **Found devices** list.
- **NOTE:** To detect more devices, touch **Scan for devices**.
- **3** To initiate a connection with a device, touch the name of the device.
- 4 You may be prompted to enter a password to authenticate. Enter the same password on both devices, or enter the password provided by the device manufacturer. Ensure that you read the documentation of the pairing device to check if it requires a default password.
- **5** When the pairing is successful, **Paired but not connected** is displayed under the paired device.
- **NOTE:** To listen to the music using a Bluetooth headset, pair and connect it first with your device.
- **NOTE:** The message indicating successful pairing may vary depending on the type of the paired device.
- **NOTE:** Pairing is a one-time process. Once your device successfully pairs with another device, your device recognizes that device without the need to re-enter the password.

## To terminate a pairing partnership

- 2 Under the **Paired devices** section, touch the icon next to a paired device.
- **3** Touch **Unpair** to erase all pairing information with that device. You need to re-enter the password if you want to restore a Bluetooth connection to that device.

## To change your device's Bluetooth name

- Ensure that you have turned on Bluetooth on your device ( icon in the status area of the system bar indicates that Bluetooth is enabled).
- 2 Touch the Home button → Apps button →
   Settings → Wireless & networks → Bluetooth settings →
   Device name.
- **3** Enter a name to identify the device when you connect using Bluetooth.
- 4 Touch OK.

## Gallery

To view and manage the pictures and videos stored on your device,

touch the Home button  $\bigcirc$   $\rightarrow$  Apps button  $\longrightarrow$  Gallery



The **Gallery** application displays not only the pictures and videos stored on your SD card, but also those uploaded to the Picasa web album of your Gmail account which you signed in with on your device.

#### To share or delete albums

All pictures and videos are grouped in separate albums as overlapping thumbnails, according to their dates, sources, or folders in which they are stored. For example, pictures taken using the device camera are grouped as Camera, and downloaded pictures are grouped as Download.

1 Touch and hold an album until the album is highlighted and the action bar appears on the top of the screen.



- Touch more albums to select them if you want to do the same task for those albums. To cancel selection, touch the album again.
  - Touch **1** to view information about the selected album.
  - Touch **to post the selected album to Picasa or video** album to YouTube, or to send the album using Bluetooth, messaging, e-mail, and so on.
  - Touch 🗂 to delete the selected album.

## To browse picture and video thumbnails

- 1 Touch an album to display the thumbnails of all pictures and videos in the album.
- 2 To browse the thumbnails:
  - Flick thumbnails horizontally until the desired thumbnail is located.
  - From the action bar on the top of the screen, touch **By album** or **Images and videos** to sort the thumbnails as desired.
- **3** To select a thumbnail, touch and hold a thumbnail until it is highlighted and the action bar appears on the top of the screen.
  - To post a selected picture or video to Picasa, YouTube, or to send it using Bluetooth, Messaging, or Email, Gmail, and so on, touch
  - To delete a selected picture or video, touch

## To display a full picture

Touch a desired picture thumbnail to display the picture in full screen.

- Flick the picture to view the next or previous one.
- To bring up the picture viewing controls, touch anywhere on the screen.
- To zoom the picture in or out, you can:
  - Pinch the picture with two fingers, and then move the fingers away from each other to enlarge the view of the picture, or bring them closer together to reduce the view of the picture.
  - To zoom in or out on a particular area of the picture, tap that area twice.
  - When a picture view is being enlarged, flick or drag the enlarged picture across the screen until the required area appears.

## To play a video

- 1 Touch a video thumbnail to start playback of the video.
- 2 To control playback, use these controls below the viewing screen:
  - Touch the button to pause and the button to resume playback.
  - Touch or drag the playback progress bar at the bottom to rewind or fast-forward the video.



## To open Music


The Music library screen opens, which is organized by **Artists**, **Albums**, **Songs**, and **Playlists** tabs. You can touch a tab to display your desired category.

## To select a song



- All the available music files are grouped into these categories: Artists, Albums, Songs, and Playlists. Touch a category to view the list within it. NOTE: If you rotate your device to landscape mode, an additional Now playing category appears.
- **2** Flick the list until you find the music you want to play. For instance, to select music by artist:
  - a Flick the list of artists in alphabetical order.
  - **b** Touch the name of an artist. A list of albums by the artist appears.
  - ${f c}$  Touch an album to find the songs in the album.
  - **d** Touch a song to open the music playback screen and play the music.
- **3** indicates the current album or song being played.

## To control music playback



- 1 The album's cover image if present.

- Touch the playback control bar to jump to any part of the song.
  - Drag and scroll the playback control bar forward to fast-forward the song.

- Touch once to jump to the beginning of the song.

- **7** The duration of the song.
- **8** The name of the artist, album, and the song being played.
  - Touch and hold the artist, album, or song to search for relevant information or videos from the Internet using the **Browser** or **YouTube** application, or do the search inside the **Music** application.
- 9 Touch to cycle through the repeat modes.
- 10 Touch to turn the shuffle mode on and off.

**11** Go to the **Now playing** list.



**NOTE:** Press the volume up button or volume down button to adjust the playback volume.

## To create a playlist

- 1 On the **Music** screen, touch the **Artists**, **Albums**, **Songs** tabs as needed.
- 2 Flick the screen until you reach the artist, album, or song that you want to add to the playlist.
- **3** Touch and hold the artist, album, or song that you want to add in the playlist. A pop-up menu opens.
- 4 Touch Add to playlist.
- 5 In the Add to playlist window, touch New.
- **6** Enter the name for your new playlist in the text field and then touch **Save**.

## Calendar

Use the calendar to schedule and manage your events, meetings, and appointments.

## To open the calendar

Touch the Home button  $\textcircled{a} \rightarrow Apps$  button  $\longrightarrow$  Calendar



## To set up an event

- 1 On any calendar view, touch the icon around the top right corner to open the event details screen.
- 2 Type the event name using the on-screen keyboard.
- 3 If you have set up more than one account on your device, in the Calendar option, choose the account calendar to which to add the event

- **4** If there is a time period for the event, touch and type the **From** and **To** date and time.
  - If the event is a special occasion such as a birthday or spans a whole day, set the **From** and **To** date, and then select the **All day** check box.
- **5** Type the event location and description.
- **6** Decide whether it is a recurring event in **Repetition** and choose how often it occurs
- 7 In **Reminders**, set when the reminder appears before the event.
- **8** To invite your friends to join this event, type their e-mail addresses into the **Add guests** text box. The invitation will be e-mailed to them when this event is set up.
- **9** Touch **Done** and the event is created.
- **NOTE:** To quickly set up an event in day, week, or month view, touch and hold an empty time slot. A new event details screen opens with the selected time slot and date in the **From** and **To** fields

### To view the calendar

You can display the calendar in daily, weekly, or monthly view. To change the calendar view, touch the **Day**, **Week**, or **Month** tab.

While viewing the calendar you can:


- In the Day or Week view, touch an event to open a quick view window of the event. On the quick view window, you can touch **Details** to view details about the event, or touch **Delete** to delete the event.
- Touch and hold an event to modify the event.

## To view and synchronize multiple calendars

If you have set up more than one account on your device, you can view multiple calendars from the accounts on your device. You can configure which calendars to synchronize to the device, and which of those to show or hide on the device in **Calendar**.

To set whether calendars are visible, follow the steps below:

- 1 In Calendar, under the Day or Week view, the controls panel on the right displays all the calendars from the accounts you have on your device, indicated by tabs with different colors.
- 2 If you want to show the events from an account's calendar, touch the account name to make it highlighted.
- **3** If you want to hide the events from an account's calendar, touch the account name again to make it unhighlighted.



To set whether calendars are synchronized to the device, follow the instructions below:



- 2 The current time and date.

- **6** Touch to return to the last Home screen you viewed.
- 7 Touch to turn the backlight down to the minimum level.
  - Touch and hold to turn off the backlight and only display the current time and date.

**NOTE:** To turn on the backlight, touch anywhere on the screen.

- **8 Dock settings**: Allows you to configure dock settings, such as audio, insertion sound, and so on.
- **9** Add alarm: Allows you to set alarms.

**10** Alarms: Allows you to open the Alarms screen and view the alarms that have been set.

#### To set an alarm

On the **Alarms** screen, clear the green check box of the alarm time you want to disable.

#### To delete an alarm





## Starting Your Device in the Safe Mode

If you find your device does not work as expected because of an application you installed, try to start your device in the Safe mode. In the Safe mode, all third-party applications are disabled and you can remove any problematic applications to continue using your device normally.

To enter the Safe mode:

- 1 Ensure that your device is powered off.
- 2 Press and hold the Power and Sleep/Wake button **6** to turn on your device.

- The DELL logo appears twice as the device starts up.
- **NOTE:** To exit Safe mode, turn off your device and turn it on again.

## **Emergency Recovery**

If your device does not turn on or respond due to corrupt system files, you can perform an emergency recovery by restoring your device to the factory default state, or by upgrading the software on your device.

- 4 Press the power button (b) to start the reset process.

**5** Wait for the device to restart.

## To upgrade the device software

- **1** Insert an SD card on your computer.
- 2 On your computer, go to **support.dell.com** and follow the instructions to download the software upgrade package "update.pkg" and save it on the SD card.
