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# Before working inside your computer

## Before you begin

- 1 Save and close all open files and exit all open applications.
- 2 Shut down your computer.

The shut-down instruction varies depending on the operating system installed on your computer.

- Windows 10: Click Start  $\rightarrow \bigcirc$  Power  $\rightarrow$  Shut down.
- Windows 8.1: On the Start screen, Click the power icon 0  $\rightarrow$  Shut down.
- Windows 7: Click Start  $\rightarrow$  Shut down.

## NOTE: If you are using a different operating system, see the documentation of your operating system for shut-down instructions.

- **3** Disconnect your computer and all attached devices from their electrical outlets.
- **4** Disconnect all attached network devices and peripherals, such as keyboard, mouse, and monitor, from your computer.
- 5 Remove any media card and optical disc from your computer, if applicable.

- 4 Connect your computer and all attached devices to their electrical outlets.
- **5** Turn on your computer.

## Removing the base cover



#### Procedure

- 1 Close the display and turn the computer over.
- **2** Loosen the captive screws that secure the base cover to the palm-rest assembly.
- **3** Remove the screws that secure the base cover to the palm-rest assembly.
- 4 Using a plastic scribe, pry the base cover from the palm-rest assembly.

**5** Lift the base cover off the computer.



# Replacing the base cover



#### Procedure

- 1 Align the tabs on the base cover with the slots on the palm-rest assembly and snap the base cover into place.
- 2 Replace the screws that secure the base cover to the palm-rest assembly.
- **3** Tighten the captive screws that secure the base cover to the palm-rest assembly.

# Removing the battery

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#### Prerequisites

Remove the base cover.

## Procedure

- 1 Remove the screws that secure the battery to the palm-rest assembly.
- 2 Turn the battery over.

**3** Disconnect the battery cable from the battery.



**4** Turn the computer over, open the display, and press the power button for five seconds to ground the system board.

# Replacing the battery



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## Procedure

- 1 Connect the battery cable to the battery.
- 2 Turn the battery over and align the screw holes on the battery with the screw holes on the palm-rest assembly.
- 3 Replace the screws that secure the battery to the palm-rest assembly.

### **Post-requisites**

Replace the base cover.

# Removing the hard drive

# Replacing the hard drive

## Procedure

- 1 Align the screw holes on the hard-drive bracket with the screw holes on the hard drive.
- 2 Replace the screws that secure the hard-drive bracket to the hard-drive.
- 3 Slide the hard-drive assembly into the slot on the palm-rest assembly.
- **4** Replace the screws that secure the hard-drive assembly to the palm-rest assembly.

# Removing the memory modules

#### Procedure

1 Peel off the mylar tape from the memory modules.

- **2** Use your fingertips to carefully spread apart the securing clips on each end of the memory-module slot until the memory module pops up.
- **3** Remove the memory module from the memory-module slot.

# Replacing the memory modules



#### Procedure

1 Align the notch on the memory module with the tab on the memory-module slot.

2 Slide the memory module firmly into the slot at a 45-degree angle and press the memory module down until it clicks into place.



NOTE: If you do not hear the click, remove the memory module and reinstall it.

# Removing the wireless card

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### Prerequisites

- 1 Remove the <u>base cover</u>.
- 2 Remove the <u>battery</u>.

### Procedure

- 1 Disconnect the antenna cables from the wireless card.
- 2 Remove the screw that secures the wireless card to the system board.

**3** Slide and remove the wireless card from the wireless-card slot.

# Replacing the wireless card



#### Procedure

- 1 Align the notch on the wireless card with the tab on the wireless-card slot.
- 2 Slide the wireless card at an angle into the wireless-card slot.
- **3** Press the other end of the wireless card down and replace the screw that secures the wireless card to the system board.

4 Connect the antenna cables to the wireless card.

The following table provides the antenna-cable color scheme for the wireless card supported by your computer:

# Removing the coin-cell battery

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CAUTION: Removing the coin-cell battery resets the BIOS setup program's settings to default. It is recommended that you note the BIOS setup program's settings before removing the coin-cell battery.

#### Prerequisites

- 1 Remove the <u>base cover</u>.
- 2 Remove the <u>battery</u>.

## Procedure

1 Lift the mylar tape off the coin-cell battery.

2 Using a plastic scribe, pry the coin-cell battery out of the battery socket.

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# Replacing the coin-cell battery



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## Procedure

- 1 With the positive-side facing up, snap the coin-cell battery into the battery socket.
- 2 Adhere the mylar tape over the coin-cell battery.

- 1 Replace the <u>battery</u>.
- 2 Replace the <u>base cover</u>.

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## Removing the power-adapter port



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### Prerequisites

- 1 Remove the base cover.
- 2 Remove the battery.

## Procedure

1 Disconnect the power-adapter port cable from the system board. **2** Using a plastic scribe, pry the power-adapter port out of the socket on the palm-rest assembly.

- 1 Place the power-adapter port in its socket on the palm-rest assembly.
- 2 Connect the power-adapter port cable to the system board.

- 1 Connect the processor-fan cable to the system board and adhere the mylar tape.
- 2 Align the screw holes on the processor fan with the screw holes on the system board.
- **3** Replace the screws that secure the processor fan to the system board.
- 4 Route the display cable and connect it to the system board.

# Replacing the video-card fan



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## Procedure

- 2 Replace the screws that secure the video-card fan to the system board.
- **3** Connect the video-card fan cable to the system board.
- 4 Route the antenna cables and connect them to the wireless card.

- 2 Replace the <u>base cover</u>.

# Removing the heat sink

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WARNING: The heat sink may become hot during normal operation. Allow sufficient time for the heat sink to cool before you touch it.



CAUTION: For maximum cooling of the processor, do not touch the heat transfer areas on the heat sink. The oils in your skin can reduce the heat transfer capability of the thermal grease.

#### Prerequisites

- 1 Remove the <u>base cover</u>.
- 2 Remove the <u>battery</u>.

## Procedure

1 Peel off the mylar tape from the memory modules.

- 2 Loosen the captive screws that secure the heat sink to the system board.

# Replacing the heat sink

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CAUTION: Incorrect alignment of the heat sink can damage the system board and processor.



NOTE: The original thermal grease can be reused if the original system board and heat sink are reinstalled together. If either the system board or the heat sink is replaced, use the thermal pad provided in the kit to ensure that thermal conductivity is achieved.

## Procedure

- 1 Align the captive screws on the heat sink with the screw holes on the system board.
- 2 Tighten the captive screws that secure the heat sink to the system board.
- **3** Adhere the mylar tape over the memory modules.

- 1 Replace the <u>battery</u>.
- 2 Replace the <u>base cover</u>.

# Removing the speakers

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## Prerequisites

- 1 Remove the base cover.
- 2 Remove the battery.

## **Procedure**

1 Disconnect the speaker cable from the system board. **2** Note the speaker-cable routing and lift the speakers, along with the speaker cable, off the palm-rest assembly.

# **Replacing the speakers**

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## Procedure

- 1 Route the speaker cable and, using the alignment posts on the palm rest, place the speakers in position.
- 2 Connect the speaker cable to the system board.

- 2 Replace the <u>base cover</u>.

# Removing the display assembly



#### Prerequisites

- 1 Remove the <u>base cover</u>.
- 2 Remove the <u>battery</u>.

### Procedure

- 1 Disconnect the antenna cables from the wireless card.
- 2 Note the antenna-cable routing and remove them from the routing guides on the video-card fan.
- **3** Disconnect the display cable from the system board.

**4** Note the display-cable routing and remove the display cable from the routing guides on the processor fan.

- **5** Open the palm-rest assembly to an angle of 90 degrees.
- 6 Place the computer at the edge of a table with the display hanging over.
- 7 Remove the screws that secure the display assembly to the palm-rest assembly.

8 Lift the display assembly off the computer.



# Replacing the display assembly



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### Procedure

- 1 Place the palm-rest assembly on the edge of a table with the keyboard facing down.
- **2** Align the screw holes on the hinges of the display assembly with the screw holes on the palm-rest assembly.
- **3** Replace the screws that secure the display assembly to the palm-rest assembly.
- 4 Close the display.
- 5 Route the display cable and connect it to the system board
- 6 Route the antenna cables and connect them to the wireless card.

- 1 Starting from the right, gently place the system board on the palm-rest assembly.
- **2** Align the screw holes on the system board with the screw holes on the palm-rest assembly.
- **3** Replace the screws that secure the system board to the palm-rest assembly.
- 4 Connect the battery cable, speaker cable, power-adapter port cable, keyboard cable, keyboard-backlight cable, power-light cable and touch-pad cable to the system board.

- **3** Replace the <u>video-card fan</u>.

# Flashing the BIOS

You may need to flash (update) the BIOS when an update is available or when you replace the system board.

Follow these steps to flash the BIOS:

- 1 Turn on your computer.
- 2 Go to www.dell.com/support.
- 3 Click **Product support**, enter the Service Tag of your computer, and then click Submit.



NOTE: If you do not have the Service Tag, use the auto-detect feature or manually browse for your computer model.

- 4 Click Drivers & downloads → Find it myself.
- 5 Select the operating system installed on your computer.
- 6 Scroll down the page and expand BIOS.
- 7 Click **Download** to download the latest version of the BIOS for your computer.
- 8 After the download is complete, navigate to the folder where you saved the BIOS update file.
- 9 Double-click the BIOS update file icon and follow the instructions on the screen.
