- **3** Disconnect your computer and all attached devices from their electrical outlets.
- **4** Disconnect all attached network devices and peripherals, such as keyboard, mouse, and monitor from your computer.
- 5 Remove any media card and optical disc from your computer, if applicable.
- 6 Close the display and turn the computer over.

After working inside your computer



CAUTION: Leaving stray or loose screws inside your computer may severely damage your computer.


- 1 Replace all screws and ensure that no stray screws remain inside your computer.
- 2 Connect any external devices, peripherals, or cables you removed before working on your computer.
- **3** Replace any media cards, discs, or any other parts that you removed before working on your computer.
- 4 Connect your computer and all attached devices to their electrical outlets.
- **5** Turn on your computer.

Removing the base cover

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Procedure

- 1 Loosen the captive screw that secures the base cover to the computer base.
- **2** Using your fingertips, gently pry the base cover to release the tabs from the slots on the computer base.
- **3** Lift the base cover off the computer base.



4 Disconnect the battery cable from the system board.



Replacing the base cover

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Procedure

- 1 Connect the battery cable to the system board.
- 2 Slide the tabs on the base cover into the slots on the computer base and snap the base cover into place.
- **3** Tighten the captive screw that secures the base cover to the computer base.

Removing the battery

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
Prerequisites

Remove the base cover.

Procedure

- 1 Remove the battery cable from the routing guide on the computer base.
- 2 Remove the five screws (M2x4 T8) that secure the battery to the computer base.

3 Lift the battery at an angle off the computer base.



4 Turn the computer over, open the display, and press and hold the power button for five seconds to ground the system board.

Replacing the battery

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Procedure

- 1 Slide the battery in the slot on the computer base and align the screw holes on the battery with the screw holes on the computer base.
- 2 Replace the five screws (M2x4 T8) that secure the battery to the computer base.
- **3** Route the battery cable through the routing guides on the computer base.

Post-requisites

Replace the base cover.

Removing the memory modules

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
Prerequisites

Remove the base cover.

Procedure

1 Use your fingertips to carefully spread apart the securing-clips on each end of the memory-module slot until the memory module pops up.

2 Remove the memory module from the memory-module slot.



Replacing the memory modules


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Procedure

1 Align the notch on the memory module with the tab on the memory-module slot and slide it firmly into the slot at an angle. 2 Press the memory module down until it clicks into place.



NOTE: If you do not hear the click, remove the memory module and reinstall it.



Post-requisites

Replace the <u>base cover</u>.

Removing the hard drive



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CAUTION: Hard drives are fragile. Exercise care when handling the hard drive.



CAUTION: To avoid data loss, do not remove the hard drive while the computer is in sleep or on state.

Prerequisites

Remove the base cover.


Procedure



The latch on the hard-drive locking connector is fragile. Pulling the latch forcefully may damage the hard-drive locking connector. Exercise care when handling the latch on the hard-drive locking connector.

- **1** Using a plastic scribe, lift the latch and use the pull tab to disconnect the harddrive cable from the system board.
- **2** Remove the four screws (M2.5x3 Ladder type) that secure the hard-drive assembly to the computer base.

3 Lift the hard-drive assembly, along with its cable, off the computer base.



4 Disconnect the interposer from the hard-drive assembly.



5 Remove the four screws (M3x3) that secure the hard-drive bracket to the hard drive.

6 Remove the hard-drive bracket off the hard drive.



Replacing the hard drive

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CAUTION: Hard drives are fragile. Exercise care when handling the hard drive.

Procedure

- 1 Align the screw holes on the hard-drive bracket with the screw holes on the hard drive.
- 2 Replace the four screws (M3x3) that secure the hard-drive bracket to the hard drive.
- **3** Connect the interposer to the hard-drive assembly.
- **4** Align the screw holes on the hard-drive assembly with the screw holes on the computer base.
- **5** Replace the four screws (M2.5x3 Ladder type) that secure the hard-drive assembly to the computer base.
- 6 Connect the hard-drive cable to the system board and close the latch to secure the hard-drive cable.

Post-requisites

Replace the base cover.

Removing the solid-state drive

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CAUTION: Solid-state drives are fragile. Exercise care when handling the solid-state drive.



CAUTION: To avoid data loss, do not remove the solid-state drive while the computer is in sleep or on state.


Prerequisites

Remove the base cover.

Procedure

1 Remove the screw (M2x3) that secures the solid-state drive to the computer base.

2 Slide and remove the solid-state drive from the solid-state drive slot.



Replacing the solid-state drive

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


CAUTION: Solid-state drives are fragile. Exercise care when handling the solid-state drive.

Procedure

- 1 Align the notch on the solid-state drive with the tab on the solid-state drive slot and slide the solid-state drive into the solid-state drive slot.
- 2 Press the other end of the solid-state drive to align the screw hole on the solidstate drive with the screw hole on the computer base.

3 Replace the screw (M2x3) that secures the solid-state drive to the computer base.



Post-requisites

Replace the <u>base cover</u>.

Removing the wireless card

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
Prerequisites

Remove the base cover.

Procedure

- 1 Remove the screw (M2x3) that secures the wireless-card bracket to the to the wireless card and system board.
- 2 Remove the wireless-card bracket from the wireless card.
- **3** Disconnect the antenna cables from the wireless card.

4 Slide and remove the wireless card from the wireless-card slot.



Replacing the wireless card

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Procedure



CAUTION: To avoid damage to the wireless card, do not place any cables under it.

- 1 Align the notch on the wireless card with the tab on the wireless-card slot.
- 2 Slide the wireless card at an angle into the wireless-card slot.
- **3** Connect the antenna cables to the wireless card.



4 Align the screw hole on the wireless-card bracket with the screw hole on the wireless card and the system board.

5 Replace the screw (M2x3) that secures the wireless-card bracket to the wireless card and system board.



Post-requisites

Removing the coin-cell battery

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CAUTION: Removing the coin-cell battery resets the BIOS setup program's settings to default. It is recommended that you note the BIOS setup program's settings before removing the coin-cell battery.


Prerequisites

Remove the base cover.

Procedure

1 Disconnect the coin-cell battery cable from the system board.

2 Peel off the coin-cell battery from the battery socket on the computer base.



Replacing the coin-cell battery

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Procedure

- 1 Adhere the coin-cell battery into the battery socket on the computer base.
- 2 Connect the coin-cell battery cable to the system board.

Post-requisites

Replace the base cover.

Removing the rear cover

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
Prerequisites

Remove the base cover.

Procedure

1 Remove the four screws (M2x3 Big head) that secure the rear cover to the computer base.

2 Slide and remove the rear cover from the computer base.



Replacing the rear cover

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Procedure

- 1 Slide the tabs on the rear cover into the slots on the computer base and snap the rear cover into place.
- 2 Align the screw holes on the rear cover with the screw holes on the computer base.
- **3** Replace the four screws (M2x3 Big head) that secure the rear cover to the computer base.

Removing the palm rest and keyboard assembly



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
Prerequisites

- 1 Remove the <u>base cover</u>.
- 2 Remove the <u>battery</u>.
- **3** Remove the <u>rear cover</u>.

Procedure

- 1 Open the latches and disconnect the touch-pad cable and keyboard-backlit cable from the system board.
- **2** Remove the 15 screws (M2.5x5) that secure the palm rest and keyboard assembly to the computer base.

3 Remove the two screws (M2.5x8) that secure the palm rest and keyboard assembly to the computer base.



4 Turn the computer over and open the display.

5 Using a plastic scribe, release the tabs on palm rest and keyboard assembly from the slots on the computer base.



6 Lift the palm rest and keyboard assembly at an angle.

7 Open the latches and disconnect the keyboard cable and the power-button board cable from the system board.




8 Lift the palm rest and keyboard assembly off the computer base.



- 9 Remove the <u>power-button board</u>.
- **10** Remove the <u>touch pad</u>.

11 After performing all the above steps, you are left with the palm rest and keyboard assembly.



Replacing the palm rest and keyboard assembly



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Procedure

- 1 Replace the <u>touch pad</u>.
- 2 Replace the <u>power-button board</u>.
- **3** Align and place the palm rest and keyboard assembly on the computer base.
- **4** Slide the keyboard cable and the power-button board cable into the connectors on the system board and close the latches to secure the cables.
- **5** Press down the edges of the palm rest and keyboard assembly and snap it into place.
- 6 Close the display and turn the computer over.
- **7** Replace the 15 screws (M2.5x5) that secure the palm rest and keyboard assembly to the computer base.
- 8 Replace the two screw (M2.5x8) that secure the palm rest and keyboard assembly to the computer base.
- **9** Slide the touch-pad cable and the keyboard-backlit cable into the connectors on the system board and close the latches to secure the cables.

- 1 Replace the <u>rear cover</u>.
- 2 Replace the <u>battery</u>.
- **3** Replace the <u>base cover</u>.

Removing the I/O board

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
Prerequisites

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Procedure

- 1 Align the screw holes on the I/O board with the screw holes on the computer base.
- 2 Replace the two screws (M2x3) that secures the I/O board to the computer base.
- **3** Slide the I/O-board cable into the connector on the I/O board and close the latch to secure the cable.

- 1 Follow the procedure from step 3 to step 9 in "<u>Replacing the palm rest and keyboard assembly</u>".
- 2 Replace the <u>rear cover</u>.
- **3** Replace the <u>battery</u>.
- 4 Replace the <u>base cover</u>.

Removing the fans

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



- 2 Peel off the tape that secures the left-fan cable to the system board.
- **3** Remove the three screws (M2x3) that secure the left fan to the system board.

4 Lift the left fan, along with its cable, off the computer base.



- **5** Disconnect the right-fan cable from the system board.
- 6 Remove the three screws (M2x3) that secure the right fan to the system board.

7 Lift the right fan, along with its cable, off the computer base.



Replacing the fans

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Procedure

- 1 Align the screw holes on the left fan with the screw holes on the computer base.
- 2 Replace the three screws (M2x3) that secure the left fan to the computer base.
- **3** Connect the left-fan cable to the system board.
- **4** Adhere the tape that secures the left-fan cable to the system board.
- **5** Align the screw holes on the right fan with the screw holes on the computer base.
- 6 Replace the three screws (M2x3) that secure the right fan to the computer base.
- 7 Connect the right-fan cable to the system board.

- 1 Follow the procedure from step 3 to step 9 in "<u>Replacing the palm rest and keyboard assembly</u>".
- 2 Replace the <u>rear cover</u>.
- **3** Replace the <u>battery</u>.
- 4 Replace the <u>base cover</u>.

Removing the status-light board

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Prerequisites

- 1 Remove the base cover.
- 2 Remove the <u>battery</u>.
- **3** Remove the <u>rear cover</u>.
- 4 Follow the procedure from step 1 to step 8 in "<u>Removing the palm rest and keyboard assembly</u>".


Procedure



NOTE: The status-light board includes an LED indicator for power and battery-status light/hard-drive activity light.

- 1 Open the latch and disconnect the status-light board cable from the status light board.
- **2** Remove the two screws (M2x3) that secure the status-light board to the computer base.

3 Lift the status-light board off the computer base.



Replacing the status-light board

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Procedure

- 1 Align the screw holes on the status-light board with the screw holes on the computer base.
- **2** Replace the two screws (M2x3) that secure the status-light board to the computer base.
- **3** Slide the status-light board cable into the connector on the status-light board and close the latch to secure the cable.

- 1 Follow the procedure from step 3 to step 9 in "<u>Replacing the palm rest and keyboard assembly</u>".
- 2 Replace the <u>rear cover</u>.
- **3** Replace the <u>battery</u>.
- 4 Replace the <u>base cover</u>.

Removing the speakers

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
Prerequisites

- 1 Remove the <u>base cover</u>.
- 2 Remove the <u>battery</u>.
- **3** Remove the <u>rear cover</u>.
- 4 Follow the procedure from step 1 to step 8 in "<u>Removing the palm rest and keyboard assembly</u>".
- 5 Remove the <u>status-light board</u>.

Procedure

- 1 Disconnect the speaker cable from the system board.
- 2 Remove the six screws (M2x3 Big head) that secure the speakers and woofer to the computer base.
- **3** Note the routing of the speaker cable and remove the speaker cable from the routing guides on the computer base.
- 4 Note the position of the rubber grommets before lifting the speakers.

5 Remove the speakers from the alignment posts and lift the speakers and woofer, along with the cable, off the computer base.



Replacing the speakers

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Procedure



NOTE: The rubber grommets may get pushed out while replacing the speaker. Ensure that the rubber grommets are in their position after placing the speaker on the system board.

- **1** Using the alignment posts, place the speakers and woofer on the computer base.
- 2 Route the speaker cable through the routing guides on the computer base.
- **3** Replace the six screws (M2x3 Big head) that secure the speakers and woofer to the computer base.
- 4 Connect the speaker cable to the system board.

- 1 Replace the <u>status-light board</u>.
- 2 Follow the procedure from step 3 to step 9 in "<u>Replacing the palm rest and keyboard assembly</u>".
- **3** Replace the <u>rear cover</u>.
- 4 Replace the <u>battery</u>.
- **5** Replace the <u>base cover</u>.

Removing the power-button board

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

- 1 Align the screw holes on the power-button board with the screw holes on the palm rest and keyboard assembly.
- 2 Replace the two screws (M2x2.5) that secure the power-button board to the palm rest and keyboard assembly.

- 1 Follow the procedure from step 3 to step 9 in "<u>Replacing the palm rest and keyboard assembly</u>".
- 2 Replace the <u>rear cover</u>.
- **3** Replace the <u>battery</u>.
- 4 Replace the <u>base cover</u>.

Removing the touch pad

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
Prerequisites

- 1 Remove the base cover.
- 2 Remove the <u>battery</u>.
- **3** Remove the <u>rear cover</u>.
- **4** Follow the procedure from step 1 to step 8 in "<u>Removing the palm rest and keyboard assembly</u>.

Procedure

- 1 Peel off the tape that secures the touch pad to the palm rest and keyboard assembly.
- **2** Remove the four screws (M2x2) that secure the touch pad to the palm rest and keyboard assembly.

3 Lift the touch pad, along with the cable, at an angle from under the touch-pad bracket off the palm rest and keyboard assembly.



Replacing the touch pad

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Procedure

Slide the touch pad under the touch-pad bracket. 1



NOTE: Ensure that the touch pad is aligned with the guides available on the palm rest and keyboard assembly, and the gap on either sides of the touch pad is equal.

- 2 Align the screw holes on the touch pad with the screw holes on the palm rest and keyboard assembly.
- 3 Replace the four screws (M2x2) that secure the touch pad to the palm rest and keyboard assembly.
- Adhere the tape that secures the touch pad to the palm rest and keyboard 4 assembly.

- 1 Follow the procedure from step 3 to step 9 in "Replacing the palm rest and keyboard assembly".
- 2 Replace the rear cover.
- 3 Replace the battery.
- 4 Replace the base cover.

Removing the system board

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NOTE: Your computer's Service Tag is stored in the system board. You must enter the Service Tag in the BIOS setup program after you replace the system board.



NOTE: Replacing the system board removes any changes you have made to the BIOS using the BIOS setup program. You must make the appropriate changes again after you replace the system board.



NOTE: Before disconnecting the cables from the system board, note the location of the connectors so that you can reconnect the cables correctly after you replace the system board.







Removing the heat sink



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WARNING: The heat sink may become hot during normal operation. Allow sufficient time for the heat sink to cool before you touch it.



CAUTION: For maximum cooling of the processor, do not touch the heat transfer areas on the heat sink. The oils in your skin can reduce the heat transfer capability of the thermal grease.



Replacing the heat sink

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CAUTION: Incorrect alignment of the heat sink can damage the system board and processor.



NOTE: The original thermal grease can be reused if the original system board and heat sink are reinstalled together. If either the system board or the heat sink is replaced, use the thermal pad provided in the kit to ensure that thermal conductivity is achieved.

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

Flashing the BIOS

You may need to flash (update) the BIOS when an update is available or when you replace the system board. To flash the BIOS:

- 1 Turn on your computer.
- 2 Go to www.dell.com/support.
- 3 Click **Product support**, enter the Service Tag of your computer, and then click Submit.



NOTE: If you do not have the Service Tag, use the auto-detect feature or manually browse for your computer model.

- 4 Click Drivers & downloads → Find it myself.

Diagnostics

Power and battery-status light/ hard-drive activity light: Indicates the batterycharge status or the hard-drive activity.

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NOTE: Press Fn+H to toggle this light between power and battery-status light and hard-drive activity light.

Hard-drive activity light

Turns on when the computer reads from or writes to the hard drive.

Power and battery-status light

Indicates the power and battery-charge status.

Solid white – Power adapter is connected and the battery has more than 5 percent charge.

Amber – Computer is running on battery and the battery has less than 5 percent charge.

Off

- Power adapter is connected and the battery is fully charged.
- Computer is running on battery and the battery has more than 5 percent charge.
- · Computer is in sleep state, hibernation, or turned off.

The power and battery-status light blinks amber along with beep codes indicating failures.

For example, the power and battery-status light blinks amber two times followed by a pause, and then blinks white three times followed by a pause. This 2,3 pattern continues until the computer is turned off indicating no memory or RAM is detected.

The following table shows different light patterns and what they indicate.

Table 3. Diagnostics

| Light Pattern | Problem description |
|---------------|------------------------------------|
| 2,1 | CPU failure |
| 2,2 | System board: BIOS and ROM failure |
| 2,3 | No memory or RAM detected |
| 2,4 | Memory or RAM failure |

| Light Pattern | Problem description |
|---------------|----------------------------------|
| 2,5 | Invalid memory installed |
| 2,6 | System board or chipset error |
| 2,7 | LCD failure |
| 3,1 | CMOS battery failure |
| 3,2 | PCI/video card failure |
| 3,3 | Recovery image not found |
| 3,4 | Recovery image found but invalid |

The computer may emit a series of beeps during start-up if the errors or problems cannot be displayed. The repetitive beep codes help the user troubleshoot problems with the computer.

Camera status light: Indicates whether the camera is in use.

- Solid white Camera is in use.
- Off Camera is not in use.

Caps Lock status light: Indicates whether Caps Lock is enabled or disabled.

- Solid white Caps Lock enabled.
- Off Caps Lock disabled.
